Welcome Pastor Troy!

I'm not sure who is more excited to have Pastor Troy and his family join us in the ministry at MBC, us, or Pastor Troy? It has been a long time coming. Pastor Jesse's last day was one year ago, May 31st, 2016. During that year, the search committee had to keep reminding themselves that God was working and that the circumstances probably weren't quite right for the right guy yet. Well, the Lord was working in Pastor Troy's heart during that time too, to consider moving to another ministry and another church.



Pastor Troy's title is Associate Pastor of Family Ministries. By not replacing our departing youth pastor with another youth pastor, and by issuing a title that is unfamiliar with the majority of our congregation, questions have arisen. Admittedly, I only knew of one Family Pastor when we started, and he was in a much larger church. Since then I've met two more, and had some people commend us for moving in this direction. So, let me try to shed a little more light on what Pastor Troy will be doing.

The timing has coincided with the development of our new vision, and the unique "building families" piece of that vision statement. Here it is: *Our vision is to glorify God by making disciples who join Christ to build families that transform communities.* As the vision team sought the Lord's direction, they saw the breakdown of the family as one of the areas of need in our community. Then they saw the investment our church already makes in children, youth, and marriage through our existing ministries. It was clear that God had already positioned us to focus on ministry to families.

The next logical question was, "What does God say about the family?" A New Testament central passage for the family is Ephesians 6:1-4. Verse 4 says, "Fathers, do not provoke your children to anger, but bring them up in the discipline and instruction of the Lord." *(Ephesians 6:4, NASB).* Christian parents are exhorted to, through discipline and instruction, teach their children to follow the Lord. Moving back in time to the time of David we see the same thing. "For He established a testimony in Jacob And appointed a law in Israel, Which He commanded our fathers That they should teach them to their children, ⁶ That the generation to come might know, *even* the children *yet* to be born, *That* they may arise and tell *them* to their children, ⁷ That they should put their confidence in God And not forget the works of God, But keep His commandments." *(Psalm 78:5-7).* Again, we see that spiritual instruction for children is given to parents, fathers in particular. This has its root in the Old Testament Law given through Moses. "These words, which I am commanding you today, shall be on your heart. ⁷ "You shall teach them diligently to your sons and shall talk of them when you sit in your house and when you walk by the way and when you lie down and when you rise up. *(Deuteronomy 6:6-7).*

The Biblical principle is that parents have the primary responsibility for the spiritual upbringing of their children. They shouldn't just leave it to the church. The ministries of the church exist to support, not replace, parents in this God-given responsibility. That will be Pastor Troy's ministry, helping parents (and grandparents and other adults) spiritually teach their children.

Here's his job description. The Associate Pastor of Family Ministries will be responsible for:

- Helping develop a family ministry philosophy and strategy that is based on sound Biblical principles, and coordinates the focus of our children's, youth, and adult ministries to work alongside parents for the spiritual development of their children
- Helping ministry leaders develop programs to equip parents, and the church, to disciple children and students, and reach families outside the church
- Giving support and oversight to youth, children's, and adult ministry leaders as it pertains to the family ministry strategy
- Recruiting and training leaders in family related ministries

Will he work with our youth and children? Yes. But that will not be his only focus. It's a tall order, and we realize we need to be careful not to put too much on his plate as the details of day to day ministry are sorted out. Please warmly welcome Pastor Troy and his family. And pray for him, and for me, as we shape and develop this new ministry.



Prayer Ministry





The Guatemala fund pays for the Mission Team's transportation, housing, and food; on the ground costs in Guatemala such as transportation and interpreters; and supplies for the work project and Vacation Bible School. This year we are partnered with Hebron Church in Itzapa City for the VBS. The team will help install a prefabricated wall around a piece of land where Oscar's ministry CTEN (Commission to Every Nation) will build a training center for pastors and church leaders.

Come when you can for however long you can to help cut, print, glue, assemble, etc. projects for the Vacation Bible School. Our theme this year is "The Wordless Book."

Guatemala Playground Fund: Missions Ministry has committed to a 4-5 year campaign to raise \$15-20,000 for a Kids Around The World (KATW) playground. KATW "harvests" unwanted commercial grade playgrounds in the US, refurbishes, and ships them to countries in need. We are raising funds for the cost of a project and will send a team to Guatemala to install the playground, under the



guidance of KATW staff. In our 1st year of fundraising, we have raised \$3,554.41 (+ the May 24th Papa Murphy's proceeds) towards the purchase of a playground! Thank you for your support!









One Meal Program: This year we raised \$4,000 which purchased 16,000 meals through Kids Around The World. On April 29th over 50 men, women, and children gathered at the Monroe Middle School to package the meals. Hungry children in Nicaragua will not only receive food, but the Gospel Message as well! Thank you for your support!
