Jeremiah: Prophet for the Times

I. Jeremiah's Ministry Call

God's message is a persevering message, (1:1-10)

II. Jeremiah's Message to Carry

a warning of judgment, (2:17-19, 29, 35)

and welcoming of repentance, (3:12-15)

but also with promise of His provision for restoration. (23:5-6; 31:31-34)

III. Jeremiah's Message is Current (Romans 11:11-17; Ephesians 2:1-22)

Complete fulfillment is still in the future, but spiritual blessings can be mine now!

Application Questions - *These questions are provided for your further study and application of the subject of today's message. Thoughtfully writing out answers to these questions will help drive home the point. They are designed to be discussed in your home, with other believers, and in a Life Group, for even more benefit.*

1. What event is Acts 17:31; Romans 2:5; Hebrews 9:27 & Rev. 20:11-15 talking about? How does Hebrews 10:31 describe this event?

Do you talk about this with your yet-to-believe family members and friends? Why or why not? Do they know about it, and how serious it is? Who's telling them? Who should be? What makes it hard to give this message?

2. 2 Corinthians 5:10 and 1 Corinthians 3:10-15 talk about a similar coming event for believers. What is it? How is it different from the event above?

What response should this stir in every believer? Is it working in you?

3. What message does Jesus tell the disciples to give people in Luke 24:47? Do the preaching of Peter (Acts 2:38; 3:19) and Paul (Acts 17:30; 20:21) show that they got the message? Why would it be important to hear this?

Is this a message you hear today? Do you tell others? Why or why not?

4. Read Ephesian 2:8-9. Our personal salvation is by _____ through _____. (fill in the blanks). How might the response to this be different from someone who has grasped the judgment and repentance described above with the response of someone who hasn't?

5. Delivering a difficult message can be very discouraging. What attitude does Hebrews 10:36 and Romans 15:4 encourage us to have? Read Hebrews 13:5-6. What does the Lord want us to know?
