What warning does the Psalmist give? What consequences does he point out?

How would you characterize your heart toward worship?

What do you see in this Psalm that you might do to help you deepen your worship experiences?
3. Read Exodus 20:3-6. What first two of the Ten Commandments are in these verses?

Knowing that God is fully righteous how is this jealousy good?

What kinds of things can easily find a place "before God" in your life?

What helps you guard against that happening?
4. In Revelation chapter four we are given a picture of worship in heaven. Why is the Lord being worshiped?

If you were there, how would you respond? What application can you make from this to your life?
5. What is the main application of this study, and/or the sermon and its passages, for you?
