Overcommitted?

I recently sat in a meeting with people representing various organizations in Monroe who are concerned about the needs of local youth. In the meeting it wasn't long before the busyness of everyone came up. The discussion centered on all the activities for youth from sports, to school, to YMCA, to Parks & Rec, to church. One attendee, a mother, said, "We are so busy it's hard to have one meal a week together. There are so many choices, just between good things. The things my kids want to do are all good!" One comment in the meeting was that it is becoming more common for students to be burned out in sports before they even get to High School. I often think we are simply teaching our children to be busy! At the recent Fall Conference I attended, one pastor asked for ideas on how to reduce the number of ministries in their church because his people were so busy.

Are the church programs the "cause" of our busyness? I don't think so. One lady at the meeting said, "They used to respect Wednesdays as a church night but they don't even do that anymore." The secular world we live in won't give us time for spiritual formation programs. Should that surprise us? It isn't that we shouldn't be involved in secular activities; we should be, because that's where our opportunities for witness are. We also need to be involved in spiritual growth activities with other believers. Too much commitment to either area is likely to take its toll on the other area in our lives. Even more importantly, it is likely to take its toll on our families. In our vision we have identified "*Building Families*" as a primary focus. We need to give adequate time and attention to building our own families if we hope to build other families in our community.

I sometimes suggest we use a weekly one-one-one guideline for church activity. That is, one worship service, one activity that spurs our spiritual growth with other believers, and one place of service. More than that, and other things have to give. Perhaps it would be wise to limit ourselves to one secular activity at a time too?

I often think of Paul's experience on his second missionary journey. "They passed through the Phrygian and Galatian region, having been forbidden by the Holy Spirit to speak the word in Asia; ⁷ and after they came to Mysia, they were trying to go into Bithynia, and the Spirit of Jesus did not permit them; ⁸ and passing by Mysia, they came down to Troas. ⁹ A vision appeared to Paul in the night: a man of Macedonia was standing and appealing to him, and saying, "Come over to Macedonia and help us." ¹⁰ When he had seen the vision, immediately we sought to go into Macedonia, concluding that God had called us to preach the gospel to them." (*Acts 16:6-10, NASB*). I wonder how often I've pushed ahead when the Holy Spirit was saying no? Or, how many times the Holy Spirit was saying go here, or do this, and I was oblivious?

No, "one-one-one" isn't God's formula. Ultimately, the Holy Spirit, and not a formula, should be where we look before making commitments. If even those who've yet to believe are feeling the stress of overloaded schedules how will we reach them? I suspect that a believer, who has not over committed himself, and possesses a corresponding calm disposition, might be a pretty powerful draw.

The most common Scripture at funerals is the 23rd Psalm. It says, "He makes me lie down in green pastures; He leads me beside quiet waters. ³ He restores my soul; He guides me in the paths of righteousness For His name's sake." (*Psalm 23:2-3*). Maybe we should be looking at how this applies to our lives while we're still living.

Forgiving One Another

Marriage in this age is always marriage to another sinner. Acknowledgment, confession, and forgiveness of sin will be a regular part of any authentic marriage. Expect to find something unforgiven beneath a heart of marital contempt.

Now, forgiveness is not the same as trust. Marriage is the most intimate of human relationships, and with that comes its explosive potential for betrayal and hurt. The call to forgive is not a call to feign trust. Sin has consequences; trust is quickly lost and slowly restored. But for the Christian, we never have a reason to withhold forgiveness. No human, even our spouse, has wronged us as much as we have wronged God, and if we claim the name of Christ, we claim he has forgiven us.

Part of what it means for me as a husband to be head of our marriage is that God calls me to go ahead and apologize first. I cannot recall a single instance in ten years in which any tangle was totally her fault. In our spats, tensions, and run-ins, we're not always equally at fault, but we both have been imperfect and sinful in some way. I always have some problem in me to identify and confess. My calling as a husband is not to save face, but have the egg on my face first.

What We've Needed Most

What makes the vision of Ephesians 4:32 distinctively Christian is those last six words: "... as God in Christ forgave you." It all starts with our Father's heart and actions of forgiveness toward us. Kindness toward each other begins with God's kindness toward us in Christ. God has forgiven me, therefore I can forgive her. Therefore, my heart can be tender, compassionate — not just in general, but specifically toward her. Therefore, I can act with kindness.


Ultimately, it is the kindness of God that melts an unforgiving spirit, softens a hard heart, and transforms unkind actions. What we've needed most in our ten years has been to be Christian toward each other. And what's been most catalytic is kindness. Greater than any need for my wife to hear the charge to submit has been my hearing the charge to be kind to her — because of how kind God has been to me.






