Is Good Doctrine Dying?

I. Look at Self (13)

To uphold good doctrine...

I need to know sound doctrine
I need to live sound doctrine
I need to exercise faith in Christ
I need to exercise love of Christ

II. Look at Speaking Up (14)

To uphold good doctrine...

I need to walk in the Spirit
I need to exhort to sound doctrine
I need to expose erroneous doctrine

III. Look at Support (15-18)

To uphold good doctrine...

I need to support those who teach sound doctrine

It is by my <u>living</u>, <u>defending</u>, and <u>supporting</u> of others, that I uphold, or erode, sound doctrine.

On a scale of 1-10, 1 being poor and 10 being excellent, how would you rate your understanding of good doctrine? On that same scale how would Jesus assess your living of good doctrine?

3. Read Romans 8:5-10. What is Paul trying to stress to his readers (v. 9)? What is the expected outcome of this truth?

How would you apply this truth to living and defending sound doctrine?

4. Read Philippians 1:3-5 and 4:15-16. What is Paul thankful for from the Philippian church?

In what ways do you, and can you, support those who spread sound doctrine?

5. What is the main application of this study, and/or the sermon and its passages, for you?
