## When God is Silent

I. Contrary People (1 Samuel 3:1; Judges 21:25)

People had substituted their own <u>authority</u> for God's, and they were not <u>hearing</u> from Him.

II. Calling a Leader (1 Samuel 3:2-13; 7:1-11, 15-18)

God was heard by one who would faithfully listen and obey.

III. Crowning a King (1 Samuel 8:1-9; 9:15-10:1)

God gave those who rejected His authority what they *insisted*.

When those around you <u>reject God's authority</u> He will still <u>speak</u> to you if you will <u>listen</u> and <u>obey</u>.

Is there something that you do that others might say shows God isn't really your God? How can you address it?

3. According to Romans 10:9 what have we confessed when we became believers? What did Jesus reinforce to the disciples in John 13:13?

What effect have these truths had on your everyday life?

What change(s) might you make so that these truths are more evident in your life?

4. Read Luke 8:16-21. What important spiritual truth is Jesus teaching in the parable and the comment to the crowd?

How well do you listen to God? How do you listen to God?
