2. Read the following verses and note the authority and submission in each: Ephesians 6:1-2; 5:22; 5:21; Romans 13:1-2; Hebrews 13:17; and John 12:49. What might be the source of a person's resistance to authority? What might be the source of submission to authority?

What would God say is your attitude toward authority in general? What would He say about your attitude toward authority in the home, in your workplace, in the church? What is one way you could make your attitude toward authority more honoring to God?

- 3. Read Paul's parting words to the leaders of the church at Ephesus in Acts 20:24-32. What does he remind them of, and warn them of? What does he "commend" them to (v. 32), and how would they apply this?
- 4. Read about the church at Ephesus in Acts 19:1-20. Then read the message given to the church some 30 years later in Revelation 2:1-5. What happened? What are they told to do?

Do you see any parallel's in your life to the church in Ephesus? Is the Lord calling you to do something in response to this?
