Hello March!

Increasing and Decreasing



There are several "big" things going on around me right now. Some are church-related, such as the search for an Associate Pastor and moving the Café service into the sanctuary. There are a couple other things equally big, and several smaller things that require time and attention as well. Another area of "big things" is missions related – my preparation for a Pathways trip in March, Pathways training here in April, and preparations for a summer mission trip to Guatemala. And some "big" things are personal, such as moving my parents into an-

other facility, which hasn't gone so well thus far. Jennifer tripped over the dog we were watching and dislocated a finger on each hand and sprained her wrist. She now has a splint on each hand, a wrist brace, and my "domestic" duties have suddenly grown exponentially! And a man suffering from deep depression has been calling me daily, sometimes 3-4 times a day for about a month now, to ask for prayer, and ask if there is any hope for him. I've tried to help him get his eyes off of himself and onto the Lord, but it seems to be fruitless. Someone said to me, "You're being hit from all sides!" In the midst of this the Lord gently revealed to me the other day that most of my prayers, and thoughts, are centered on me. I'm in a "poor me" slump. Have you ever been there? I suspect most of us have been there from time to time. I know that we all have had stressful things like these to deal with, and some of you have had, or are still in, even more difficult situations.

I recalled a memory verse from some time ago that I thought I should meditate on. It is, "If you have run with footmen and they have tired you out, Then how can you compete with horses? If you fall down in a land of peace, how will you do in the thicket of the Jordan?" (*Jeremiah 12:5, NASB*). Jeremiah is complaining to God who basically tells him to toughen up because even worse times are coming! We don't have to look very far in the pages of Scripture to find people who've endured much more difficult circumstances than we face, do we?

We should look to the Lord for help, and He encourages us to do so, (Matthew 7:7-11; 11:28-30). No doubt, He helps us through difficult times. And yet, there is also the reality that, to a certain extent, we have to suck it up too. Living in the balance can be a challenge. But there's more.

I'm being challenged with self-focus in the book on worship that I'm working through with some men from our church. The author makes the point that what makes worship excellent is not the aesthetics, the liturgy, the music, or the like. It is the object of worship, God Himself. He writes, "At the heart of the Fall is the self-love that destroys our God-centeredness." There is a great need to center on God, to delight in God, and to lose ourselves.

This takes me to one of the sweetest worship experiences I've had. It was in Liberia, Africa. The building was mud brick. The walls were not painted, the floor was dirt, and the only furniture was a few rickety wood benches. There were no instruments. Men just sang, they sang together. I didn't understand one word. But I could see that they sang of the greatness of God, and they sang out of dependence on God, and they sang out of love for God. I knew I stood in the midst of true worship, it was good, and I was caught up in it, even though not one part of it was about me.

This is not to say that we should, or should not, upgrade the sanctuary. It's just a reminder that either way, it's our hearts that are under God's microscope. And I'm being reminded in multiple ways – it isn't about me – not my comfort, not my way, not my likes or dislikes, but His glory. There is a freedom, a relieving freedom, when I can let go of things, and not make them be about me, myself, and I.

Under the direction of the Holy Spirit David wrote, "Bless the LORD, O my soul, And all that is within me, *bless* His holy name." (Psalm 103:1, NASB). Responding to hardship isn't always – God take it away, or suck it up, but, dare I say, it is to worship the One who was, and is, and always will be, at the center of everything. As John the Baptist aptly said, "He must increase, but I must decrease." (John 3:30)

The cost will be \$7.00 payable on the 9th.




Prayer!


A Bride in the Bargain by Deeanne Gist


