Are YOU being joined to Christ?



You can expect to see a trifold brochure soon that outlines our vision. The hang-up at this point is what we will use for discipleship material. In the "Joining Christ" portion of our vision we want to recommend a resource(s) to help people either move forward in their own walk with Christ, or use it to help others. There's a lot of different material out there, and it's difficult to find something suitable for everyone and, at the same time, useful to give a good rounded foundation for further growth.

Perhaps because that's on my mind, my attention was directed to *Ephesians 4:17-32* in today's New Testament reading. After three chapters of exhortations about the believer's identity and blessings in chapters 1-3, Paul begins to give practical instructions. In what might be construed as a basic list of do's and don'ts we find what struck me as a foundational principle of discipleship. Paul first urges his readers to, "walk no longer just as the Gentiles also walk," a walk described as ignorant of God, hard-heartedness, depraved, and excluded from God (verses 17-19). He reminds them of first coming to faith in Christ and of the subsequent teaching about Christ they received (20-21). He then urges them to "lay aside" the life of the old self, be renewed in their minds, and to "put on" the new person that they are in Christ (verses 22-24). My initial thoughts were that this is great for new believers! But then I realized no, wait a minute, it's good for all of us!

As I strive to live a life "Joined to Christ" I have to continually resist the temptation to follow the "Gentile walk," the values and ways of the unregenerate world I live in. Daily Christian living, one of the descriptive phrases we use to define Joined to Christ, helps us remember that we've been called to an everyday way of living. Our union with Christ gives us a new and different way of seeing the world we live in, hence, a lifestyle of different priorities than the "Gentile" world we live in.

Our first encounter with the living Lord Jesus was a call to a personal relationship with Him. Paul reminded his readers in Ephesians to reflect on that beginning and the things they first learned about Christ. It's very easy to begin to equate the Christian life with the things we've learned to do, and to not do, and lose sight of the special relationship we now have with the Lord. The other descriptive phrase we use to define *Joining Christ* is "*A Deepening Personal* Relationship". As I focus on deepening my relationship with the Lord Jesus, I find myself far more likely to be living in a way that pleases Him than if I try to follow a list of do's and don'ts.

Renewing the mind, laying aside the old self and putting on the new person Christ has made me to be – that's pretty practical. If we combine that with some separation from the world's values, and sincerity about living in a personal relationship with Christ, we're going to be on a discipleship path, a path that joins us with Christ and what He's doing. To be sure, it is a spiritual battle, because we have an adversary, and our deceitful, and sinful, old self doesn't want us to live as the new persons we've become in Christ. But, "greater is He who is in you than he who is in the world" (*1 John 4:4, NASB*). How exciting to see the Lord work as we seek to establish ourselves, our households, and new believers, in these simple discipleship principles!






