God Promises

I. The Word of the Lord (1)

The Predicament... exiled in captivity.

The Promise... I will bring you back to your land.

The Proclamation... the Lord stirred the Gentile king to act!

Me? My own prosperity, or God's purpose & promises?

II. The Word of the King (2-4)

The Deference... the Lord has given me and appointed me.

The Decree... whoever is willing, go and build.

The Donations... support them with freewill offerings.

What God promises in His <u>Word</u> He brings about in His <u>world</u>!

What does this say about how the individual believer is to think and act in relation to the community of believers? Does your life line up?

- 4. What covenant promises did God make in the passages below? Genesis 12:1-3; 17:1-8
- 2 Samuel 7:8-13

How did God want His people to see themselves? What did God want His people to be to the world?

5. How do we reconcile God's desire for His people (question #4) and what He allowed to happen to them (questions 2 & 3)?

What effect did the Israelites conduct, and the consequences, have on God's covenant with them?
