

# Kim & Yvonne Heinbaugh Alaska

Greetings! Since my last letter the people of the Copper River Valley have experienced several more deaths. Our valley is flooded with grief. Conveying the Cross-Cultural aspect of our ministry has been challenging to us over the years. We serve in our own country, but we serve in a mixed community. We have a mixed school

system and even the congregation is mixed. We really do minister to two separate and distinct cultures. The way the two "put away" their dead certainly have their similarities, but they are different

The indigenous people view the quality of relationship by quantity of time spent together. Visitation and funeral services are always done on two consecutive days and are full day affairs. The closest funeral homes are in the Anchorage area 200 miles away, so the body, family, and friends travel to Anchorage. Shopping is done for food and items that will be needed to feed 200+ people breakfast, lunch, and dinner the next 2-3 days.

Traditionally the graves are all dug by hand, even at -30 or -40 degrees. Six to eight men volunteer or are appointed the privilege to serve the family in this way. When the ground is frozen to depths of 3 ½ feet in colder winter months, they build a fire and cover the ashes, pushing the heat down to thaw the next 3-4 inches and repeat this process until they reach the six-foot level.

A caravan forms behind the vehicle chosen to transport the loved one back "Home" and a 4 to 5-hour drive begins. When the caravan arrives at the village community hall, people visit until a 5 pm dinner meal is shared before the visitation service, which begins around 7 pm. That service usually lasts a few hours, with a fellowship time after with desserts and coffee, ending around 10 pm.

Funerals are normally scheduled at 1 o'clock in the afternoon. The funeral itself takes about two hours with some mingling together before heading to the gravesite. Time spent at the gravesite pushes two hours as people surround the family singing and giving testimony and encouraging the grave diggers as they shovel the dirt back into the grave. A hand built fence is placed to mark the grave and flowers are arranged on the grave and a closing prayer and or song is made.

From there it's back to the hall for light refreshments and visiting until the Potlatch begins with the evening meal around six or seven. A night of eating, dancing, and speaking culminates with the family addressing the group and giving out gifts they have put up over the years to honor their loved one and the gifts they have received from the loving concern of those around them. It all follows a strict traditional etiquette designed to unify, strengthen, and encourage during the time of trial and loss. It's a beautiful part of the culture here. I have really come to appreciate the way they manifest their love and concern for one another.
