Busy is Ok, Rushed is Not

In conversation with a friend the other day we were talking about some high capacity people in ministry. He said he didn't think he was very high in the talent scale. I suggested that I think I'm a one. We were referring to the parable of the talents that Jesus told in Matthew 25:14-30. I probably should have said a two, because the one talent man wasn't faithful! The talents illustrated God-given abilities and opportunities. Since the parable right before this one was about being ready for the Lord's return at any moment, it's



a good reminder to be faithful with the abilities God has given us and in what He has given us to do.

It seems that there's application in this to the state of busyness in which many of us find ourselves. One thing we can take from this is that it's ok to be busy, because Jesus was saying we should be, until He returns. Jesus lived a busy life. If He wasn't moving to another location, people were seeking Him out. Crowds would gather and He would teach. People asked questions, people sought healing, the religious leaders tried to trip Him up.

Here's what I would call the key, Jesus was busy, but He wasn't rushed. When I cross the "busy" to the "rushed" line, busy becomes stress. In being busy, I have to be ok with who I am, and with what capacity I have. We all have differing capacities (1 to 5 talents in the parable). Jesus also kept Himself focused on His purpose (see Mark 1:36-39 for an example). He was able to say "no" to the demands of others, because His focus was on the priorities of His purpose. Did He meet the demands and expectations of every person? I don't think so, and I think He was ok with that. We can learn to be the same.

I also think Jesus addressed our over-busy lives when He said, "Come to Me, all who are weary and heavy-laden, and I will give you rest. ²⁹ "Take My yoke upon you and learn from Me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and YOU WILL FIND REST FOR YOUR SOULS. ³⁰ "For My yoke is easy and My burden is light." (*Matthew 11:28-30, NASB*). If we are constantly weary & heavy laden we've probably taken on more than Jesus has given us. Under His "yoke" He is with us, helping pull the load. We can be busy but not burdened. We should not forget, Jesus took His disciples away for some rest when needed (Mark 6:31-32).

Do you know what God's purpose is for your life? Here's three biggies that apply to all of us: *worship, walk with Christ*, and *make disciples*. Jesus said, "But an hour is coming, and now is, when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth; for such people the Father seeks to be His worshipers." (John 4:23). God seeks those who will authentically worship Him. Worship rightly aligns us to the sovereign Creator of this world. Secondly, walk with Christ. The apostle Paul wrote, "Therefore as you have received Christ Jesus the Lord, *so* walk in Him." (*Colossians 2:6*). The "walk" Jesus is talking about is with Christ as Lord which would include both obedience and a personal relationship. Thirdly, make disciples, *Matthew 28:19-20*, "Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ teaching them to observe all that I commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age." This is the mission God gave His church and all His followers.

How we live out these life purposes will differ between different people. But these purposes should still be major focuses for all of us who are believers. I like to encourage people to use 1-1-1 as a guideline. One worship service each week (even on vacation!), one activity with other believers for personal growth (such as life group or class), and one place of serving in ministry. There's lots of different ways we can apply these priorities and this guideline; we need to do it. In the parable of the talents, the desired words to hear at life's end are, "Well done thou good and faithful servant" (*Matt. 25:21, KJV*). If other things leave no room to apply these priorities what words might we hear from Jesus? Yes, I've written about busyness two months in a row. It seems to be a struggle common to so many of us that we need to overcome.



Our team leaves July 7 and returns July 15. Oscar, our Guatemalan Missionary, has identified the need for emotional and spiritual help to people living in shelters due to the volcanic eruption. In light of this, some mornings the team will work at the building site for training pastors and church leaders, and other mornings they will be showing God's love at a shelter. This will be our 2nd year working with Hebron Church in Itzapa City for the

Vacation Bible School in the afternoons. Our VBS will be 5 days instead of the usual 4 days, and our team members will be teaching the Bible Lessons with an interpreter. The theme this year is "Jesus Is God Who Cares For People."
