Spiritual Claims, or Reality?

I. Spiritual Mysteries (Col. 2:4-8)

Don't be taken in by human reasonings! Remember what you've received!

Spiritual mystery is solved in *Christ*.

Stick to the course you've started!

II. Spiritual Deficiencies (Col. 2:9-15)

Christ Jesus is fully *God* and *man*.

Spiritual completeness is gained by *union* with *Christ*.

In Christ the powerful deficiencies overcome include:
Sinful nature – power cut off
Death – turned to life
Transgressions – forgiven
Debt to God – lifted
Evil spirits – disarmed

Why would you turn anywhere else?

Are my <u>actions</u> consistent with spiritual reality?

3. Read Ephesians 1:3-14. What are some of the realities pointed out in these verses for the Christian through their union with Christ?

How does knowing these realities help you live the Christian life more fully?

4. What does the author of Hebrews say about endurance in Hebrews 10:36 & 12:1, and why?

In what area does Jesus stress the need to "stay the course"? (John 8:31-32) Why?

Think about the connection between knowing and doing the Christian life. Where does it tend to break down? What can you do to guard against it?
