What particular concern for children does Jesus express? (v. 11-14)

List 2-3 practical ways adults in a family can apply what Jesus teaches here. What are 1-2 practical ways the local church can make application?

3. Read Mark 10:13-16. What was the response of the disciples to parents bringing children to Jesus? (This is after the scene in Matthew 18 above!)

What was Jesus' response toward what the disciples were doing?

What is your attitude toward children? More like the disciples, or like Jesus? Give some examples.

Why might it be hard for adults to have the same view of children as Jesus?

4. The apostles also use children to illustrate Biblical truth. What principles are taught in 1 Corinthians 14:20 and in 1 Peter 2:2?

Look back over the study above. Write the names of one or more children and/or young people that you think God would have you influence for Him.

How will you do it?
