Follow Me!

In my quiet time reading the other day I found my attention drawn to Jesus's words, "Follow Me." In John 21, after His resurrection, Jesus had made breakfast for the disciples on the beach. He gave Peter a threefold exhortation to "tend His sheep" (verses 15, 16, 17), then let him know by what kind of death he would glorify God. After this He then said to Peter, "Follow Me!" (verse 19). Peter turned around, and



seeing John following them, says to Jesus, "Lord, and what about this man?" That's when we read the response of Jesus, "If I want him to remain until I come, what *is that* to you? You follow Me!" (*John 21:22, NASB*)

Obviously, these words are a great reminder, and perhaps a chiding to us all. We should focus our attention on our own call to follow Jesus and not to be so concerned about what He has asked of others and what they are doing. It isn't that we shouldn't be concerned about others following Jesus, but surely the more we're concerned about others the less attention we're paying to our own walk!

However, that wasn't what grabbed my attention. Rather, it was the words "Follow Me." I was, and still am, challenged with the question, "Am I really following Jesus?" It's pretty easy to assume we're following Jesus once we know a little about the Bible, the life of Christ, and the gospel message. But couldn't I have a LOT of Bible knowledge, and really be following my own thoughts and ideas, instead of following Jesus?

What did "Follow Me" mean for Peter's life? What does it mean for you and me to follow Jesus? One doesn't have to think long to come up with a couple of other situations in which Jesus said the same words. For example, "My sheep hear My voice, and I know them, and they follow Me;" (*John 10:27*). Jesus said that following Him, and listening to Him, is characteristic of every true believer! Since that's the case, we should know what it means, and be very focused on doing it!

Jesus seemed to put even more weight on following Him in Matthew 10 when He said, "He who loves father or mother more than Me is not worthy of Me; and he who loves son or daughter more than Me is not worthy of Me. ³⁸ And he who does not take his cross and follow after Me is not worthy of Me. ³⁹ He who has found his life will lose it, and he who has lost his life for My sake will find it." (*Matthew 10:37-39*). Here Jesus emphasizes following Him in the context of loving Him more than anyone, and being willing to leave everything! This is no small invitation!

Jesus tells us that following Him is listening to Him more than anyone else, loving Him more than anyone else, and leaving more for Him than anything else. It's a pretty simple concept, but a huge commitment isn't it? I'm going to be talking about this in the upcoming sermon series. But, as my thoughts went that morning, what does one receive in return? Well, one receives a personal walk with Jesus, and a deepening relationship with Him. How does anything we could have in this world compare? Nothing else comes anywhere near, not even close! Are you all in?

Every baseball player needs a glove & bat in order to effectively play his role on the team. These tools help him function at his best as a baseball player. Every handyman will have a toolbox when he enters your home to fix the problem you have called him about. In it will be essential tools, including hammers, screw drivers, pliers, electrical tape, and other necessary items that make his job a success.

What does every Christian parent need in his/her toolbox to help guide and lead their sons and daughters into a faith that can withstand and thrive in our society today?

The Bible clearly instructs parents to lead and instruct the next generations in the scriptures, and in keeping God's Word. This is not an option for the Christian family. Unfortunately, we sometimes struggle to find a means and the time to instruct them in the things of God, and bypass this valued time in showing our children who God is and what He is doing in this world. I believe that the parent's toolbox should be intentionally packed with the best tools, a little courage, and a willingness to investigate how it best works for his/her family. With that said, I want to recommend that you consider "The New City Catechism". This tool may sound old and dusty, but I assure you, it's anything but that. I recommend you make it part of your family toolbox. The New City Catechism is an App you can get on your phone, ipad or computer and allows you, your child, and your teens to discuss a single doctrine or truth of God every week of the year. Simply set aside one 15 minute segment of time each week with your family around the table to discuss questions such as "Who made you?", "What else did God create?", & "Who is God". There are 52 weeks of questions, songs, and commentary in this creative App. The app allows you to have these discussions at home or on the road with the phone app. You will find this in your App Store online. You can also buy The New City Catechism as a desk top calendar or in book form online by doing a search.

I also recommend that you include in your parenting toolbox the new, *Monroe Bible Church: Family Bible Reading Plan.* Every Christian family needs to read God's Word with their children, and help form a habit of daily reading time with God. How else will our children form these habits?

Most of the best baseball players will spend hours daily working on ground balls & considering scenarios on where to throw the ball when it is hit to them. When game time comes around and a ball is hit to them on the field, they automatically respond according to what they have faithfully practiced. In our society today, we must be intentional in discipling our children on who God is and what the Mission is that He has called us to. Your children's spiritual health demands it. Check out these new resources. They are both free and readily available.
