4. Read Jeremiah 23:16-32. What is God angry about? What is it about God that the false prophets have failed to acknowledge?

How can you apply verses 22-24 to your life today?

5. Read Isaiah 40:21-28. How is God described? How should knowing and believing this affect a person? (verses 29-31)

Can you think of an example when you applied this knowledge of God to yourself, or to another person in their circumstance? Was it helpful? Explain.
