Enriched, or Plundered?

I think my favorite Psalm for the rest of this year will be Psalm 145. I'm challenging myself, and you too, for the rest of the year with this definition of a disciple. In the September 9th sermon I defined a disciple of Christ as one who, "*loves Him more than anything, listens to Him more than anyone, and leaves more for Him than for anything.*" Hence, when I came to Psalm 145 in my personal through-the-Bible reading I felt like I'd hit a gold mine! There I found an example in David, and a number of reasons to love God.



Consider the "I will" statements he opens the Psalm with in the first seven verses. "*I will extol You*, my God, O King, And *I will bless Your name forever* and ever. ² *Every day I will bless You*, And *I will praise Your name forever* and ever. ³ Great is the LORD, and highly to be praised, And His greatness is unsearchable. ⁴ One generation shall praise Your works to another, And shall declare Your mighty acts. ⁵ On the glorious splendor of Your majesty And *on Your wonderful works, I will meditate*. ⁶ Men shall speak of the power of Your awesome acts, And *I will tell of Your greatness*. ⁷ They shall eagerly utter the memory of Your abundant goodness and will shout joyfully of Your righteousness." (*Psalm 145:1-7, NASB*)

Look back through these verses for what David says the congregation will do. He speaks not only of his own commitment, but also that of the congregation. There is a sense of *compulsion* to give God worship! This can only come from a personal experience with God. I find myself asking, "When was the last time I really extolled and blessed the Lord?" Do I really even know what it means? When did I last meditate on His works, goodness, righteousness, or tell others of His greatness? How about you? Been a while? What causes this kind of response to well up within us? What hinders this response from happening in us?

Notice how David continues speaking of the attributes of God in verses 8-13. "The LORD is gracious and merciful; Slow to anger and great in lovingkindness. ⁹ The LORD is good to all, And His mercies are over all His works. ¹⁰ All Your works shall give thanks to You, O LORD, And Your godly ones shall bless You. ¹¹ They shall speak of the glory of Your kingdom and talk of Your power; ¹² To make known to the sons of men Your mighty acts and the glory of the majesty of Your kingdom. ¹³ Your kingdom is an everlasting kingdom, And Your dominion *endures* throughout all generations." (*Psalm 145:8-13*). Take a pen and underline the reasons David gives for praising God. Can you point to circumstances in your life in which you, experientially, came to know some of these truths about God?

Finally, David speaks confidently of what God will do in the rest of the Psalm. "The LORD sustains all who fall And raises up all who are bowed down.¹⁵ The eyes of all look to You, And You give them their food in due time.¹⁶ You open Your hand and satisfy the desire of every living thing.¹⁷ The LORD is righteous in all His ways and kind in all His deeds.¹⁸ The LORD is near to all who call upon Him, To all who call upon Him in truth.¹⁹ He will fulfill the desire of those who fear Him; He will also hear their cry and will save them.²⁰ The LORD keeps all who love Him, But all the wicked He will destroy.²¹ My mouth will speak the praise of the LORD, And all flesh will bless His holy name forever and ever." (*Psalm 145:14-21*). Are you confident that this is who God will be to and for you?

There is so much more to learn about the character and works of God. Would not knowing God in these ways in our experience be more enriching than anything we experience in the world? Of all the decisions I make in a week's time, I wonder which ones truly enrich, and which actually plunder my life? How about you? Will you strive with me to, "*love Him more than anything, listen to Him more than anyone, and leave more for Him than for anything*"?



Because of emerald ash borer damage to our three large trees, it is necessary to remove them. We'll be requesting help for this process.




There is a sign up sheet at the Welcome Center for you to sign up to help. We plan to do the tree removal October 20th beginning at 8 am. Lunch will be provided.
