Checking the Furnace

Each year as I read through the gospel of Luke, I always stop at Luke 5:16 and ask myself, "I wonder how Jesus did this?" Here is the verse, "But Jesus Himself would *often* slip away to the wilderness and pray." (*Luke 5:16, NASB*). How could Jesus slip away from a crowd, wasn't He the center of attention? And what did He slip away to pray about?

One of the distinct aspects of Luke's gospel is the number of times he references Jesus praying. I've listed the references here just to get a scope of the circumstances and subjects of His prayers.

Jesus was praying at His baptism (Luke 3:21)

After many miracles, when people sought Him, He had retreated to a secluded place to pray (Luke 4:42) and then announced He would move on to other towns.

He spent the whole night in prayer before choosing the twelve disciples (Luke 6:12).

Before He asked the disciples, "Who do the people say that I am?" He was "praying alone." (Luke 9:18).

He took Peter, James, and John up the mountain "to pray," and it was "while He was praying" that He was transfigured (Luke 9:28-29).

He gave praise to the Father when the seventy returned from their ministry (Luke 10:21).

It was, "while Jesus was praying in a certain place, after He had finished" (Luke 11:1) that one of the disciples asked Him to teach them to pray. Jesus then gave what we call *The Lord's Prayer*.

In Luke 22:39-46 we have the account of Jesus agonizing in prayer just hours before His crucifixion. There He urged the disciples to pray as well.

In Luke 23:34 we read of His prayer for those nailing Him to the cross.

And last but not least, He cries out from the cross, "Father, into your hands I commit my spirit." (Luke 23:46).

I use a prayer list, which is helpful. My morning quiet time is my set time to intervene for people. I pray with others as opportunity arises, and before and after meetings, but Jesus' example always seems to remind me that there's another level (actually several levels) of prayer that I have not yet reached. How often did Jesus just slip away to commune with the Father?

Ever feel like your responsibilities and the world we live in won't let you slip away to spend some time with the Lord in prayer? Ever feel the need to slip away and have thoughts such as, "I don't have time...I have to do this or that...I'm afraid I'll miss something I shouldn't miss... people will think I'm wasting time"? I can come up with a hundred "reasons" why I can't slip away. Are they valid reasons, or is it my own thinking that holds me captive to the tyranny of the urgent?

This reminds me of a short little article I read many years ago. A wife was relating the story of waiting in the car with their friends for her husband. They were leaving their house to go somewhere together and the husband excused himself to "check the furnace." The guests were a bit baffled at how long it took, especially when there wasn't a problem with the furnace. Turns out, he never left the house without going downstairs to pray.

Perhaps we would all do ourselves well to arrange a "checking the furnace" cue to let those closest to us know that we are "slipping away" for a bit. Perhaps equally difficult would be the need to check our own negative thoughts about those who do slip away. The National Day of Prayer is in May. It would be a good month to establish a new prayer practice!


Adam & Emily Holverson - jiran collective


This book is available for purchase by signing up at the Welcome Center. If you sign up, I will make sure you get a copy.

So far \$11,153.31 (about 46%) has been raised towards this year's trip.

Update:

Many of you are probably wondering what is happening at 18 & 8th. Here is an update on happenings at our building. Renovations began about a month ago. New bathrooms both upstairs and downstairs have been plumbed, framed, and drywalled. A fantastic



crew of our congregants have been faithfully putting a fresh coat of paint on every wall throughout the facility. Flooring upstairs in the entry way is next as well as installation of the plumbing fixtures and

bathroom dividers. Twenty-two tall chairs have been purchased and refurbished with memorial money. These chairs along with tables also being donated with memorial money will furnish the front entry area. Once these renovations are complete, we hope to hold an Open House for community groups and leaders to come and see what the building has to offer as well as give them an opportunity to get involved with future projects.

There are many community groups currently using the building. AA meetings take place on Saturday mornings and Monday nights, High Tide Recovery meets on Tuesday night, Dog Obedience Classes take place Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday nights downstairs, a Family of Addict's support group meets on Sunday evenings, Backpack Buddies packs and distributes bags from a room downstairs, and a sexual abuse recovery group uses the facility. Additionally we have other groups and individuals who are inquiring on usage and some already scheduled for future use.

While the renovations we are working on now make a significant difference we are just scratching

the surface of what needs to be done. We have faith that God has big plans for 18 & 8th and we are excited to join Him in it. We're grateful for



all of the support we've received from the people at MBC, whether labor, prayers, financial, or by your encouraging words. What is happening there couldn't happen without your help! Please be on the lookout for ways you can help or serve at 18 & 8th in the future.
