December, it's the month that marks an end, the end of the year. I hope it has been a good year for you. I hope that it has been a year in which you have seen God's hand at work and found yourself marveling at His greatness. The transition from warm and sunny to cold and gray days has set in. The lush and green has given way to harvest, and now to brown and dying. And perhaps by the time you read this (said hopefully and not too loudly) the ground will be covered in a blanket of white snow.



But December also marks a beginning! It is the month we celebrate the birth of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. His birth, the union of deity and humanity, provided the way to begin a new life, eternal life, for all who would turn to Him. Jesus established the New Covenant. "When He said, 'A new covenant,' He has made the first obsolete. But whatever is becoming obsolete and growing old is ready to disappear." (Hebrews 8:13, NASB) The Old Covenant revealed God's moral law and proved our inability to live according to the standard of God's holiness. It pointed to the need of sacrifice and thus to the day Jesus would come. The new began with Jesus.

I hope you are rejoicing in the new that Jesus provided for you! For the coming of Christ into your life has changed everything! *2 Corinthians 5:17* says, "Therefore if anyone is in Christ, *he is* a new creature; the old things passed away; behold, new things have come." Jesus is like the blanket of snow that covers the dead and dying sins that once grew in our lives. He died to take the penalty for all your sins and mine (*Hebrews 7:27; 9:12, 28*). He broke the power of reigning sin in our lives (*Romans 6:6*). He went to the cross so that we could be clothed with His own perfect righteousness, and be received into God's heaven (*Galatians 3:27*). We celebrate the birth of Christ for His coming to earth marked something new.

December is often the busiest and most stressful month of the year. And all the going and doing can challenge living the new life we've received. Christmas shopping, special baking, family get-togethers, extra traveling, entertaining, and shoveling snow (hopefully), all make for a busy month. How easy it is for the busyness of December to choke out the newness of life we have in Christ. How easy it is for the noise and commotion to overshadow, even silence, conversation we could have about the One which the season celebrates!

Can I suggest that we look for slots of time, carve out blocks of time, this December to rest, to reflect, and to be renewed in the living Lord Jesus and the new life He has given us? Recently the Lord impressed on me the need to rest in and wait upon Him. For example, Psalm 37:7 begins, "Rest in the LORD and wait patiently for Him;" and three times in the first 8 verses says, "Do not fret." Perhaps if we do take this time, we might find December to be not so much the busiest month but the best month of the year!

This morning I wondered if those who've yet to believe are content with Christmas as just a holiday for food, fun, family, and gifts. Don't they have to wonder what the deeper meaning is? They could find out from us! And just maybe they might ask when they see "December" in us!

While we all knew that there was a lot of work that went into a project of this nature, we weren't fully aware of just how many details there are to work out! Such as, a name - there is so much connected with a name! While it may seem a simple task to name a building, it has proven something of a blessed challenge. We collected suggestions for names and have prayerfully chosen four (out of 20+!) to submit to the Elder Board: "The Venue", the "Gathering Place", "The Oasis", and "Eighteen & Eighth" (after the intersection the building is located on). We are excited to hear which the Elders choose!

We have begun drafting the policies and procedures, and the mission statement. As we walked the building and the grounds, we realized that there is a fair bit of cleaning up to do, as it has been vacant for a time. Along with the Deacons, we have assessed the physical needs of the building and we have begun basic cleaning inside and landscaping maintenance outside. (Volunteers welcome!)

Our latest endeavor has been in continued community research. We have spoken with numerous organizations and prominent community members, and now we are reaching out to the community and to each of you! We are looking for ideas and people willing to take action. A video has been posted to the church Facebook page asking for the communities' input. We would appreciate your help in spreading the video so you and your Facebook friends can contribute ideas as well. PAPA MURPHYS NIGHT - Wednesday, Dec. 13!!




Share the good news of Jesus' birth with this creative Christmas card.

What you need:

- Construction paper (two pieces, including one white)
- Pencil
- Scissors
- Pens
- Glue stick

What you do:

- Neatly fold the white paper in half, short side to short side.
- Draw two parallel lines (at least 2 inches apart) from the fold to about halfway to the edge. Cut along the lines.
- Fold the cut section back and forth so it pops up.
- Push the section up so it pops up inside the folded paper. Draw a nativity scene on the pop-up box.
- 5. Fold the colored paper in half, short side to short side. Place the white paper inside it and glue the white paper down, being careful not to glue the pop-up box.
- Write a Christmas message and give or send the card to someone.
