Hardships of the Christian Life?

I. Remember the Christ (8)

Knowing Jesus is reason to endure the hardships of living a Christian life!

II. Remember the Chosen (9-10)

The need of others to hear of salvation is reason to endure the hardships of the Christian life!

III. Remember the Conditions (11-13)

The gift of new life and eternal security are reasons to endure the hardships of the Christian life!

The <u>person</u> of Jesus, the <u>need</u> of others, and the <u>gift</u> of eternal life are reasons to endure the hardships of fully living the Christian life!

What has been your experience in trying to help people know these two truths?

What is your motivation to tell others? What gives, and what takes away, your motivation to tell others?

4. Write out a few statements of what Ephesians 2:8-9 and John 10:27-28 mean concerning your life. For example: I have been...I am...

In what ways are these truths having an effect on your life?
