We met last night to go over some of the details. It was for the winter fly fishing excursion to Arkansas with my son and a few other men that I've looked forward to for weeks. Each of the guys showed excitement at the prospect of fishing for trout in this trophy producing river, even if only to catch a few average sized fish. I found myself with a mixed bag of thoughts. I kept thinking I

would be happy to be quiet and be still, by myself, in the cabin. I felt like I looked forward to that prospect more than fishing! Hence, Psalm 46:10 came to mind this morning, "Be still and know that I am God" (KJV).

We often refer to that passage when we know we need a break, or to encourage someone else to take a rest. Actually, in the context of the Psalm, it's more likely directed to Israel's enemies and given as instruction for them to stop waging war against Israel. And yet the Psalm does reflect trust in God. The first verse says, "God is our refuge and strength, A very present help in trouble." (Psalm 46:1, NASB)

As I opened my Bible for some Old Testament and New Testament readings, and with my prayer list, pencil, and journal before me (which I haven't been keeping up very well lately), I told God I just need to be still before Him. When I'm feeling weary, fun isn't what I want. I want to be quiet and know the Lord's presence. The last few weeks have been stretching (four funerals between November 30th and December 15th, one of which was my dad's), and Christmas is still a week away. I thought about last Sunday's message and the location of Christ in our world as most often seen through His presence in us. The Lord brought to mind, "I have been crucified with Christ; and it is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me; and the *life* which I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself up for me. (*Galatians 2:20*). His presence, love, and self-sacrifice ministered to my soul.

January is now upon us. Perhaps you are weary from all the extra activities and expectations and commitments that come with Christmas and December. As you already know, life is made up of "seasons". Some are busy, fun, exciting, and filled with joy. There are seasons of calm, maybe boring, some filled with grief, sorrow, stress, fear, or pain. Some seasons are long, some are short. Some are filled with hope, others with disappointment.

But in every season, though we may bounce and wobble, in the Lord we have a stabilizing anchor. Hebrews 6:19 says, "This hope we have as an anchor of the soul, a hope both sure and steadfast and one which enters within the veil". And though we feel weak and vulnerable, He remains a steadfast rock to retreat to for refuge. Psalm 18:2 says, "The LORD is my rock and my fortress and my deliverer, My God, my rock, in whom I take refuge; My shield and the horn of my salvation, my stronghold." When our purpose and meaning are assaulted, and we don't know which way to go, the Lord is still our light to shine the way. "Then Jesus again spoke to them, saying, "I am the Light of the world; he who follows Me will not walk in the life." darkness, will have the Light of (John

When I get overwhelmed my tendency is to try to do more, to clean up the nagging lose ends so that I can feel some peace. I'm still learning that I need to go first to the Anchor, the Rock, and the Light for there is much in life that I cannot control. Have you learned to first go to the Lord when weary and in need of rest? The Psalmist wrote in *Psalm 130:5*, "I wait for the LORD, my soul does wait, And in His word do I hope." Are you spending some time "waiting"? January is a good month to practice!


Primetimers



Marriage Ministry



The marriage ministry recently completed 6 Pipeline sessions of The Art of Marriage small group study. Many of those that attended commented how much their marriage benefited from the excellent video content and the lively group discussions. Here are some of the questions we discussed and for you to consider discussing with your spouse.

- 1) Discuss the importance and the difference between "accepting" your spouse and "receiving" your spouse as the perfect gift from God.
- 2) Share some of the differences between you and your spouse and discuss how God may be using these differences to shape you as a person and to make your marriage stronger.
- 3) Satan is actively trying to destroy your marriage. Discuss some ways that you and your spouse may be drifting apart and what each of you can do to keep this from happening.
- 4) God's perfect design for marriage can be summed up with the phrase: equal value, distinct roles and responsibilities for men and women. Describe what this means from a biblical perspective and what it means in your marriage.
- 5) Consider how not only our words but also our heart attitude behind the words can affect healthy communication in our marriage. Explain the difference between winning an argument and resolving conflict.
- 6) Our marriages are a picture of the gospel to a watching world. Name some people who are affected by your marriage. Describe the legacy that you hope to leave for your children, grandchildren and the future generations.
