Success

Recently I received a call from the Billy Graham Association concerning someone from Monroe that contacted them, having just made a decision for Christ. They were looking for a Bible believing church to place this individual. One of the questions they asked was, "What does your church do for discipleship?" The caller was happy to hear that we have Life Groups, Next Steps, Bible studies, and our Pipeline adult class.



Whenever the question of church disciple-making comes up, inevitably the answer is programmatic. In other words, if some program is in place, discipleship is happening. Success is measured in the number of programs and the number of people in attendance. Programs such as these are certainly valuable in helping people grow in their Christian life. However, I've never been comfortable, nor satisfied, with a purely programmatic answer.

This morning in my personal devotions I saw a reference to disciple-making success that I found instructive. In the third chapter of 2 Corinthians Paul is telling the Corinthians he doesn't need letters of commendation from others for ministry credibility. Paul describes successful ministry in terms of *product not program, power not a person, and proclamation not prescription*. Let me explain.

Paul writes, "You are our letter, written in our hearts, known and read by all men; ³ being manifested that you are a letter of Christ, cared for by us, written not with ink but with the Spirit of the living God, not on tablets of stone but on tablets of human hearts." (*2 Corinthians 3:2-3, NASB*). Paul is defining the success of his ministry in terms of changed lives. The chapter closes with these words, "But we all, with unveiled face, beholding as in a mirror the glory of the Lord, are being transformed into the same image from glory to glory, just as from the Lord, the Spirit." (*2 Corinthians 3:18*). He points out that continual change is the end product. Discipleship success isn't completion of a program, it's producing changed people.

Paul then writes, "Not that we are adequate in ourselves to consider anything as *coming* from ourselves, but our adequacy is from God, who also made us adequate *as* servants of a new covenant, not of the letter but of the Spirit;" (2 Corinthians 3:5-6). He is saying that success in his ministry is not dependent on him, but on the working of the Holy Spirit. Speaking of understanding the gospel of grace and freedom from Old Testament law keeping, he writes, "but whenever a person turns to the Lord, the veil is taken away. ¹⁷ Now the Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, *there* is liberty." (2 Corinthians 3:16-17)." While human relationships are very important, it is the unleashing of the Holy Spirit's power, not the wisdom or skill of a person that produces the life change of successful disciple-making.

Lives being changed is the product, and the Holy Spirit is the power. Lastly, the prescription is addressed. Paul writes, "who also made us adequate *as* servants of a new covenant, not of the letter but of the Spirit; for the letter kills, but the Spirit gives life." (*2 Corinthians 3:6*). The old covenant was a prescription. It was law, do this, don't do that. The new covenant is the gospel. It is God's promise of forgiveness of sin, of new and growing and eternal life by grace through faith in Christ. The message is not a prescription of rules to keep but a proclamation of grace to be received and lived in. Paul never stopped proclaiming this message. Neither should any disciplemaker.

What does this mean in terms of successful disciple-making? We should take advantage of good programs and utilize good people to teach and lead. But we MUST focus on the end product of changed lives in which the Holy Spirit and gospel of Christ are continually at work. We should not be satisfied with anything less, for disciple-making is our God-given mission, and success is our desire.

In Christ we are products of successful discipleship! Through Christ and the Holy Spirit, we are successful producers of disciples! Our adequacy is not in ourselves or a program. I'm grateful.


