ENTRUSTED



I write this on the heels of completing the ninth and last of the Pathways training workshops. Over the last three years MBC has hosted three workshops each year and has now become what might be the first training site in the U.S. to host all nine training workshops. Twenty-eight different men have attended one or more of these trainings, and have passed the training on in countries in Africa, Southeast Asia, and Central America. The picture above is of the men who were able to attend this last training.

Pathways exemplifies Paul's exhortation to Timothy better than any that I've personally experienced, "The things which you have heard from me in the presence of many witnesses, entrust these to faithful men who will be able to teach others also." (*2 Timothy 2:2, NASB*). The workshops each build on the previous workshop, gradually teaching participants valuable "tools" to accurately understand God's Word so that they can accurately teach it. U.S. pastors who are taught the Pathways method are equipped to take this training to pastors in other countries who do not have opportunity for Biblical training or access to resources. The pastors in those countries in turn are expected to pass this training on to other pastors who can then pass it on to other pastors.

I write this to commend you as a church for your part in helping train and send pastors. You have supported our trainer Brad Reardon, as a missionary during this whole time. The pastor's who've come here for training have always complemented MBC for such wonderful hospitality in providing housing and meals. And lastly, you've supported me in the trips I've been on. It has been a blessing to be part of such a significant ministry with so much potential for impacting lives, spreading the gospel message, and expanding the Kingdom of God. I'm grateful to you for granting me the freedom and giving me the support to participate in Pathways. As you probably already know, in addition to helping train in Ghana and Liberia, God allowed me to be instrumental in starting this training in Guatemala, with the anticipation of spreading to 70 churches in one denomination across that country.

I also write to keep the "entrust to faithful men who will be able to teach others" principle before us. Paul is writing to Timothy who is leading the church in Ephesus. He is urging Timothy to train and give ministry responsibility to faithful men in the church who can in turn do the same to others. In verses 1-6 Paul instructs Timothy to "be strong in the grace that is in Christ Jesus," and to accept hardship, and apply self-discipline. I've seen how important this is for both the ones being trained, and the trainers!

We might each ask the Holy Spirit's help in doing some self-evaluation concerning our own faithfulness and self-discipline to follow Christ. We might ask ourselves as a church, are we training and entrusting those who've shown themselves to be faithful? Most importantly, we should understand what it means to "be strong in the grace that is in Christ." Our strength for all ministries is not in ourselves, it is in Christ. His willingness to use us, despite our weaknesses, and failures is pure grace. The fact that He would release His power through us, into the service opportunities He gives us, is pure grace. So, let's not be afraid to be entrusted, but make sure we're strong in His grace.








Save the date!



The Insanity of God - A True Story of Faith Resurrected by Nik Ripken with Gregg Lewis




place? It sure didn't work in Somalia."




Adult Fiction

Make this craft to display a bit of springtime year-round!

What you need:

- An old shirt
- Tempura paint (brown, dark pink, light pink and white)
- Paintbrush
- Light blue or white construction paper
- A paper plate
- · Q-tips
- Paper towels

What you do:

- 1. Roll up one sleeve and paint your arm and the palm of your hand brown.
- 2. Lengthwise on the paper, carefully place your painted arm and hand, with fingers spread apart. (This is the tree trunk and branches.)
- 3. Place the other paint colors on the plate.
- 4. Using Q-tips, place dots of paint (blossoms!) all over the branches.
- 5. When dry, display your tree – or give it as a Mother's Day gift.
