1-3 Year Strategy – In electronics, there is something called the bathtub curb. It says the chances of having a problem with a brand, new TV is actually quite high. Within a few weeks, that likelihood drops off to almost zero and stays there for a significant period. Then over time, as the TV deals with warming up and cooling down, dust settling on components, power fluctuations, and perhaps being moved from one house to another, the chances of failure slowly start to rise, eventually getting to the same point as when it was new. If you graph this, the resulting image resembles a bathtub, hence the name.

This is not unique to electronics; a similar pattern exists in business. We have all heard that most new business ventures fail. Then there is Sears. Sears is over 130 years old and as recently as 1990, it was the largest retailer in the United States. Today, they are hanging on by a thread.

Did you know that this phenomenon can exist in ministry? The first three years of an Awana club are the most tenuous. During these first three years, any number of factors can cause a church to discontinue Awana. After this initial period, clubs usually find their "groove" and enjoy several years of stability. Over time we start to see changes in significant positions (pastors, commanders, etc.), conflicts with other ministries, and people are less excited to volunteer. What was once a groove is now a rut. When clubs reach this point, once again the probability of the church dropping Awana is on the rise.

As a result, Awana missionaries across the country have been concentrating on building deeper and wider relationships (Awana volunteers, pastors, staff, etc.) with churches who have been using Awana less than three years. For us, this list includes 17 churches. We have also been working to get acquainted with the 34 churches that were added to us last July when our territory was expanded. Seven churches are on both lists.

This club year we have driven over 15,000 miles making these connections, visiting and speaking at clubs, attending events and trainings, and participating in missions' conferences. We praise God for keeping us safe as we have navigated the sometimes treacherous, winter roads. We are praying for a more suitable vehicle before winter returns.

Many of you partner with us through your prayers; we could not do this without you. Thank you for your prayers, for they give us the strength to journey on. Some partner with us with financial support. It means a lot that you invest your resources in this ministry. Others partner with us with spiritual gifts; we could not do this without you. Thank you for being event coordinators and volunteers, for consulting with churches, training leaders, and more. It is a privilege to come along-side you as you reach the next generation for Christ.
