Have I Gained Approval?

The "theme" that I've been challenged with lately is "sanctification" (progressive sanctification, the transforming of our daily lives to the image of Christ). The word means set apart by God, for God. It means being set apart from the things that are contrary to the will of God. It means not only separating ourselves from sinful conduct, but also separating ourselves to do the things God wants us to do. Paul writes, "For God has not



called us for the purpose of impurity, but in sanctification. (1 Thessalonians 4:7, NASB). While the context there is sexual purity, the application surely includes the many choices and activities that do or do not reflect purity to God's desire for our lives.

Perhaps that is why; in my through the Bible reading, I was recently struck by the words, "gained approval," in Hebrews 11:2, "For by it the men of old gained approval." Would sanctification be gaining God's approval? This great chapter of heroes of the faith also ends with those same words; "And all these, having gained approval through their faith, did not receive what was promised," (Hebrews 11:39). The subject is faith, "Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen." (Hebrews 11:1). Since faith is the subject of Hebrews 11, it is the necessary ingredient for gaining God's approval. Hebrews 11:6 concurs, "And without faith it is impossible to please Him, for he who comes to God must believe that He is and that He is a rewarder of those who seek Him."

The men and women commended in Hebrews 11 did courageous things, they took risks, they gave up much, and they suffered and died for holding to their faith in God. This chapter is a long list of what was given up, held onto, and lived out. The faith being talked about was a faith of action. The apostle James defined faith as action. He writes, "For just as the body without *the* spirit is dead, so also faith without works is dead." (James 2:26).

It made me wonder if we haven't settled for an insufficient meaning of faith. It made me wonder if we haven't overemphasized God's unconditional love and acceptance to the exclusion of giving thought to "gaining approval" from God. Faith is defined as an assurance, and a conviction, in Hebrews 11:1. Have we translated that into just a mental concept, perhaps an inner disposition, and left it there? I think I've been guilty of that at times.

But can we really "gain" God's approval? Isn't that earning what we already have in Christ? We are "accepted in the Beloved" (*Ephesians 1:6, KJV*), and nothing can separate us from the love of Christ (*Romans 8:35-39*). These are important truths to remember, truths that define our position with God, fully and entirely based on Christ's substitutionary death on the cross for us.

The question however, is whether I'm failing to make the distinction between my position with God, and my conduct before God. The first is the result (God's acceptance) of placing my faith in what Christ did; the second (God's approval) is the result of putting my faith to action. In other words, working out my positional salvation in daily life (*Philippians 2:12*).

It isn't easy. In chapter 10, the readers of Hebrews are urged, "Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for He who promised is faithful; (Hebrews 10:23). They are told, "For you have need of endurance, so that when you have done the will of God, you may receive what was promised." (*Hebrews 10:36*). Our sanctification, gaining God's approval, is a lifelong pursuit. It is the outflow of a vibrant relationship with Him. It's encouraging to be on this journey with you. So, "let us consider how to stimulate one another to love and good deeds, ²⁵ not forsaking our own assembling together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging *one another;* and all the more as you see the day drawing near."! (*Hebrews 10:24-25*)
