## I. The Response Suggested (3a)

Appreciate God...

Two reasons:

An attribute: His mercy

An act: He caused us to be born again

## II. The Reason Supplied (3b-5)

The act:

... for <u>new life</u>, ...

"to a living hope"

"to obtain an inheritance"

## III. The Requirement Secured (3, 5)

"Through"

"the resurrection of Christ"

"through faith for a salvation"

... <u>secured</u> by Christ's resurrection, <u>received</u> by faith.

The resurrection of Christ secured *new life* for me!

2. Read Colossians 2:9-14. What is the before, the how, and the after of the person who becomes a Christian?

Describe your before and after. (v. 13)

What is the difference between the change becoming a Christian has made on you, verses just "turning over a new leaf" on your own?

3. From the following verses, what has the resurrection of Jesus accomplished for us in our union with Him through faith?

Ephesians 2:4-6

Romans 6:4-11

4. Hardships cannot take away the believer's hope. Read Romans 4:25-5:5. What is that hope? What is it based on, and how does it become the believer's life?

What is/are the active hope(s) in your life today? Why?

Could you use a readjustment? How would that best happen?
