Why the Chaos?

Reading in Acts this morning I had to shake my head. The tradesmen of Ephesus, led by Demetrius, were upset at Paul's preaching because people were turning away from their god Artemis. They said, "Not only is there danger that this trade of ours fall into disrepute, but also that the temple of the great goddess Artemis be regarded as worthless and that she whom all of Asia and the world worship will even be dethroned from her magnificence." (Acts 19:27, NASB). They were afraid that their god might be "regarded as worth-



less," and, "even be dethroned from her magnificence." Their prosperity depended on this not happening (*verse 25*). They were upset that Paul said, "gods made with hands are no gods at all." (*verse 26*). How do people think that an object made with human hands can become a god? They were "filled with rage" over this and able to create a citywide riot.

Meanwhile, going back about 1,500 years, reading in the Old Testament section for today, something not so far off from that happens among God's people. The Israelites who have just been supernaturally delivered from slavery in Egypt are camped at Mt. Sinai. The people assured Moses, "All that the LORD has spoken we will do!" (Exodus 19:8; and 24:3). Moses is back up the mountain before God for 40 days, receiving the directions for the tabernacle, and the unthinkable happens. "Now when the people saw that Moses delayed to come down from the mountain, the people assembled about Aaron and said to him, 'Come, make us a god who will go before us; as for this Moses, the man who brought us up from the land of Egypt, we do not know what has become of him." (Exodus 32:1). "Make us a god who will go before us"? Really? So, Aaron makes a golden calf and tells the people, "This is your god, O Israel, who brought you up from the land of Egypt" (verse 4). Are you kidding?! The people worshiped and made sacrifices to the golden calf (verse 8), meanwhile Moses intercedes with God not to destroy the whole nation. He comes down the mountain to find the people, "out of control" (verse 25).

Again, I found myself shaking my head. How do people come to the point that they believe something made with human hands becomes a god? It's worth noting that in both cases chaos resulted. In both cases the people were living in contradiction to the truth about God. It makes me wonder – is this what is happening in America? Things certainly seem "out of control."

As the Christmas season approaches, I'm grateful that the one true living God has manifested Himself in various times and ways in history. I'm grateful that He inspired a record of enough of His manifestations, and of more truth about Himself, in His written Word. I'm grateful that God has preserved this written record and given His Holy Spirit to help understand it. Most of all, I'm grateful that the fullest revealing God could give, He did in sending His Son, the Savior Christ Jesus. We've been created to know God, not to make a god. What a contrast we see between the chaos of people who create gods and the calm of people who come to God. I hope you take some time to rest, reflect, and respond in worship to the One the season has been set aside to celebrate. He is the Prince of Peace!




