The crisis in Venezuela has affected our city. Only about two hours from the border, as many as 30,000 Venezuelan refugees a month have ridden or walked to the city, many to stay, many others to continue on. The area near where the mission is located is now crowded with beggars, performers, women selling dish towels or cloves of garlic, and men rushing to help people find parking spaces and to spread cardboard over the windshield in return for a few coins. Although there are government shelters and a type of tent city on the outskirts of town, there are still people sleeping on the street and many in need. It is easy to become overwhelmed and unsure where to start in reaching out to others.

At Christmas we were given a gift to give away—a plastic sack which contained a cup, toothbrush, toothpaste, bar of soap, small towel, and a Spanish New Testament. At the same time, the fruit on our three large mango trees began to ripen, and we have a bumper crop! So about three times a day I'm picking up sack after sack of ripe mangoes. Charles has been distributing them to those trying to sell their wares along the street or the parking guys. Now they're on the look-out for his arrival every day. We've also had boxes and sacks to give to indigenous people coming through the mission, to indigenous people in town for medical help, or to the shelter run by the Salvation Army. God definitely is blessing the effort because there is a lot of fruit yet on the trees, and of the many fruit, there's been very little that wasn't good.

Charles and his revision team will begin meeting this month to start the first draft for the new version of Luke. Not only is there the desire to finish Luke in 2019, but at least one other book. Much will depend on the time that Samuel and others have available to dedicate to the project, finances, and other considerations. Please continue to pray for wisdom. There are many challenges and logistical questions to be answered. Pray for clear direction for us, for the mission administration, and our Wai Wai brothers.

For me, these next several months will be quite busy with cooking for the Wai Wai revision team, council meetings, and the preparations for our Brazilian mission's 60th Anniversary celebration in March. I've also been asked to teach the women's course I developed while teaching at Word of Life Institute. A group of Baptist pastor's wives meet regularly and I was asked to teach this course on homemaking, stewardship, women's event planning, friendships, lesson preparation and teaching, and using our spiritual gifts in the church. It will take a little work to rewrite the course to fit their needs. Plus, I've been encouraged to consider putting the material in book form and seeking to have it published. I love teaching. I love writing. I love working with women. My greatest prayer request at the moment is: God's direction, wisdom, strength, and time.
