Guardraile

Guardrails serve an important purpose. They keep a person from crashing in a dangerous place if they go off the road while traveling certain stretches. Have you ever been saved by one? Fortunately, I haven't, but I'm glad we have them. There weren't guardrails when we rode the motorcycle up Mt. Washington. I'm quite sure Jennifer would not go with me on that ride again!



The scene in *Matthew 15* makes me think of guardrails. It's one of the rare times Jesus is outside Israel proper, and a Canaanite woman comes up to Jesus crying out for mercy because her daughter is, "cruelly demon-possessed." Jesus doesn't even answer her, and the disciples finally tell Him to send her away because, "she keeps shouting at us." Then the shocking response, "But He answered and said, 'I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel." (*Matthew 15:24, NASB*). Jesus had healed the servant of the Roman centurion and offered water to the Samaritan woman at Sychar. Why such a cold response to this Gentile woman?

We know that the compassion of Jesus extended beyond the Jewish people, so it wasn't an issue of compassion. Jesus knew what He would do, He would heal the little girl. Was He testing the woman's faith? Was He testing her persistence? Did He want her to serve as a demonstration of faith or persistence, or both? Perhaps all the above is true. But what struck me the other morning is the bigger picture. Jesus is declaring the direction of His life-ministry (again). He is essentially showing that He has a clear understanding of the "guardrails" of His ministry set forth by the Father.

It wasn't that He didn't care about Gentile people or wouldn't minister to them, just that the sphere of ministry the Father assigned to Him was the Jewish people. It is seen even when He sent out the disciples – "These twelve Jesus sent out after instructing them: 'Do not go in *the* way of *the* Gentiles, and do not enter *any* city of the Samaritans; ⁶ but rather go to the lost sheep of the house of Israel.'" (*Matthew 10:5-6*). Jesus still found His ministry to be fulfilling, even with this focus and limitation, "Jesus *said to them, "My food is to do the will of Him who sent Me and to accomplish His work. (*John 4:34*). In fact, at the end of His life on earth He could say, "I glorified You on the earth, <u>having accomplished the work which You have given Me to do.</u>" (*John 17:4*, underline added).

Oh, to know just what God wills us to do, the scope <u>and</u> the boundaries! I wish I was better at this. Taking on too much, or selfish ambition, causes problems (*James 3:16*), and not doing enough, laziness, is condemned as well (*Matthew 25:26, 30*).

I was visiting with an area pastor recently who said when such and such a sport begins, he doesn't see a number of families for several weeks because the games are on weekends. There is a plethora of good things today that we and our children can be involved in. Unfortunately, many of the events are on Sunday mornings. While I realize that being in church on the weekend, or not being there, doesn't make, or not make, a person a Christian, it does still communicate something. Parents, are you having spiritual conversations with your kids about what it means to be a Christ-follower and witness for Him, wherever you are? It has to be tough to be a parent today!

Maybe the example of Jesus here in *Matthew 15* can help. Do you know what the Godgiven direction is for your life? Can you recognize where some of the "guardrails" are to keep you going in that direction? When your time on earth is done, will you be able to say to the Lord, "I have accomplished the work which You have given me to do."?




OneMeal Event

- Bibles (open to Genesis 1:1-2:3 for reference)


What you do:
