I told those I was training, “This is better than a Rembrandt. His painting of Christ on the Sea of Galilee is quite famous. This is better. He was a master of paints, strokes, and shading. Your work is beautiful.”

When I said this, we were not looking at their paintings. We were looking at a simple white board where they wrote names and prayer requests for those they were training in Pathways. It was astounding. A couple began to weep as we spoke of it. The board was filled with their Asian characters representing how they are reproducing the training, so necessary in their circumstances. For security concerns I cannot show you the board. Pastors have been arrested in the city.

I can give you some of their roughly translated prayer requests: “Pray for the two Pathway groups to follow through for their benefits.” “Pray for the coworkers who start Pathway training in March.” “Pray for the trainers that they could follow through all workshops.” “Pray each student can train others in each planted church of_____.”

It was the second great Salvation Story Workshop of the trip. Earlier I was in Manila. The new Free Church president of the Philippines, Dave, attended one afternoon. He became very excited and is working to start a new training in Cebu. His plan is to bring in the best possible trainers from the islands who can then spread it throughout the Philippines. This is easier said than done. There are obstacles to overcome. Pray as we continue to plan.

We will learn how to act when faced with an emergency, distinguish between life-threatening and non-life-threatening injury, how to apply pressure in a bleed, and perform CPR techniques both by hand and with the defibrillator.
