DO YOU KNOW GEN Z?

New ministry challenges are on the horizon for our families and churches that have children born between 1999 and 2015. In this time span 70 million new babies have been born. This generation has been branded Generation Z. In order to get a handle on what makes this next generation tick, we must understand what is important to them.



Just a few traits about Gen Z according to the Georgia based Barna Research Group...

- * Gen Z is an app-savvy, tech savvy young people who have never known a time without smart phones, iPods, iPads, and other devices. Devices are becoming another appendage to our youngest generation yet.
- * 35 percent of Generation Z teens consider themselves to be atheist, agnostic, or not affiliated with any religion.
- * The public square & digital world is promoting discussion regarding LGBTQ+ issues. Our families and the Church should be too.
- Other findings show that 12 percent of Generation Z identified sexually as something other than "heterosexual," with seven percent saying they are "bisexual." "This is the highest percentage of self-identified non-heterosexual experience that we are seeing now of any generation." David Kinneman, Barna
- Seven out of 10 Generation Z teens said that they think it is acceptable to be born one gender and "feel like another."
- Just 61 percent of "churched teens" agreed that the Bible is totally accurate in all the principles it teaches.

How should we respond—As a Church? As Parents? As a Family? Paul's word to the Romans in 1:5 states, "For I am not ashamed of the gospel, for <u>it is the power of God for salvation</u> to everyone who believes..."

MBC values family devotions and Bible reading. An annual *Read Through the Bible* plan & New City Catechism are available in order to get the Word of God in front of your family. Other resources for MBC families include Sunday night Bible study for Middle School and High School, Wednesday night Awana, and Pipeline Sunday School class which is intended to equip parents, grandparents, and maturing adults to navigate your family in today's culture.

I hope to encourage our families to intentionally disciple your children during the early years of a child's life. Paul said to Timothy as an adult, "I remember your genuine faith, for you share the faith that first filled your grandmother Lois and your mother, Eunice. And I know that same faith continues strong in you." 2 Tim 1:5 Timothy was trained and equipped in his faith & theology, <u>AS A CHILD</u>. As a result of his young faith he was able to handle the challenges and stress of ministry later on. In addition, I see tremendous value in parents reading stories of faith to their children, and young families engaging their community together in service, acts of outreach, and ministry.

Next, I believe that Generation Z needs regular doses of the Gospel repetitiously preached and lived out in their homes. They won't hear it in the neighborhood, at school, or at baseball practice. We must make it a habit to discuss and reflect upon the Gospel of Jesus daily with our children. With Jesus central in your home, it won't be long before your child understands that technology can be used to share the Gospel, or it can be used by our Babylonian-like society to mislead mankind. Our children can know and experience the Power of the Word of God. Paul said in Romans 12: ² Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—his good, pleasing and perfect will.

Finally, Our kids must comprehend the Gospel themselves. Young kids can and should know the Gospel. They should be comfortable discussing the gospel. For them to stand true in their convictions in a day that is challenging the Christian faith, our kids must have a sincere conversion and a vibrant growing dependence upon Jesus.

What then is the answer? The Gospel... True Conversion... Prayer and A lifetime of Discipleship! Trusting the Gospel to uphold our Families!


