Make the Most of the Opportunity

I've given you themes to think about over the last several months. Our *His House* ministry leader, Anna Ritchard, has displayed them as paintings in the front of the sanctuary. Can you remember, "Love Him More than Anyone, Listen to Him More than Anyone, and Leave More for Him than for Anything," or "Do Life Together"? I'm sure you've noticed the newest one, "Make the Most of the Opportunity." It is taken from Colossians 4:5.



In chapter two of Colossians Paul warns his readers about the dangerous teachings of philosophies, legalism, mysticism, and asceticism. In chapters three and four Paul exhorts his readers how to live, and he concludes this section with exhortations on living in relation to those outside the church. Here's what he writes, "Conduct yourselves with wisdom toward outsiders, **making the most of the opportunity**. ⁶ Let your speech always be with grace, as though seasoned with salt, so that you will know how you should respond to each person." (*Colossians 4:5-6, NASB*).

The flow of the themes has been internal (our hearts), to external; first our fellowship, then our mission. Our lives consist of various amounts of time with those outside our homes and church family. Our time in church and fellowship are to be times of strengthening and encouragement for the time we spend with outsiders. It's important that we don't lose sight of our mission to reach outsiders with the gospel of Christ. The world, the devil, and our own flesh eagerly await opportunities to take us in the wrong direction.

Ephesians 4:26-27 says, "BE ANGRY, AND *yet* DO NOT SIN; do not let the sun go down on your anger, ²⁷ and do not give the devil an *opportunity*." The devil and his wicked helpers are always throwing things in front of us to take us down a destructive path. These "opportunities" often look innocent and justifiable. Galatians 5:13 says, "For you were called to freedom, brethren; only *do* not *turn* your freedom into an *opportunity* for the flesh, but through love serve one another." The freedom we have from a laundry list of rules, and from having to establish our own righteousness, can look like opportunity to pursue our base natural desires. That too can take us down a bad path.

While we should be aware of opportunities that lead us away from God, we should also seize the opportunities that help us stay close to Him. Our worship services are opportunities to grow in our love of God. Our ministries, especially Life Groups, are opportunities to grow through "doing life together" as we give and receive encouragement to one another. There are opportunities to interact with outsiders in some of our ministries (hopefully more at 18 & 8th soon), but many of these opportunities are the result of our daily activities and intentional choices.

How do we "Make the Most of the Opportunity"? Again, I encourage beginning with a 1-1-1 goal. One worship service, one growth group, and one Christian service activity each week. Paul also gave us good direction in *Galatians 6:10* when he wrote, "So then, while we have <u>opportunity</u>, let us do good to all people, and especially to those who are of the household of the faith." As we do good things for others, often opportunity arises to share the hope that is within us (1 Peter 3:15).

I pray that the words we all see Sunday morning, "Make the Most of the Opportunity," will remind and inspire you and me to make the most of our opportunity to deepen our relationship with the Lord through worship, be strengthened in our walk with the Lord through fellowship, and reach out to outsiders through word and deed.


