

Welcome November!

#### Thanksgiving

When I think of November the first thing that comes to mind is Thanksgiving. I like Thanksgiving because of its simplicity. Getting together to enjoy a meal and embrace a spirit of thankfulness, it's that simple. Well, I must confess, I don't do the cooking, so I will concede that there's a lot of work that goes into it. I do really like turkey, and mashed potatoes, and sweet potatoes, and cranberries, and my wife Jennifer is the best pie-maker!



When you think about the Thanksgiving Holiday you may think of the Pilgrims, the Wampanoag Indians, and the first successful harvest that was celebrated (to the credit of the Wampanoag) with a feast. I read an author's "real interpretation" on the internet that appears to be a history rewrite for the purpose of bashing white people and Christians. Hopefully that isn't what is now in the textbooks of our school children! I think the roots of Thanksgiving are really in our Christian faith. However imperfect our forefathers may have been, thankfulness to God was just part of life.

Recently, I've taken more notice of how often the New Testament writers urge their readers to give thanks to God. Jesus modeled "giving thanks" as He broke bread to feed the 4,000 (Matthew 15:36), and the bread at the Last Supper with the disciples (Matthew 26:27). Luke records one of the lepers Jesus healed, "and he fell on his face at His feet, giving thanks to Him. And he was a Samaritan." (*Luke 17:16, NASB*). Luke also records Paul urging his fellow passengers to join him in a meal, for which he is giving thanks, before their ship is broken up by waves (Acts 27:35).

Paul often let his readers know that he thanked God for them (E.g. Eph. 1:16; Col. 1:3; 1 Thess. 1:12). He expressed his gratitude to those who helped him and prayed for him (2 Cor. 1:11), even risked their necks for him (Rom 16:4). He understood this as something he "ought" to do (2 Thess. 1:3; 2:13). We see thanks given for the victory God has given (2 Cor. 2:14) and for joy in Christian liberty (Rom 14:6). In Heb. 13:15 the giving of thanks is part of praise, and in Revelation it is part of heavenly praise (Rev. 4:9; 7:12;11:17). Soberly, we take note that lack of thankfulness to God is characteristic of those who deny God (Rom. 1:21).

In his epistles, Paul urges his readers to be thankful for all things (Eph. 5:20; Col. 3:17; 1 Thess. 5:18). He encourages thankfulness to be part of all prayers (Philip. 4:6; Col. 4:2; 1 Thess. 5:4).

How much is expressing thankfulness to God a part of your daily life? I know I have lots of room for improvement. In our current "challenge" to spend at least 10 minutes a day (5 minutes in prayer and 5 minutes in the Word) 5 days a week, let's make the giving of thanks a part of that time. Look for thankfulness in Scripture and give God thanks for many different things as you pray. We can teach our children to always be thankful. We can learn to let thankfulness be a regular part of our conversation, both at home and in the public. Wouldn't it be a powerful testimony for our Lord to be known as the people who are always thankful!

"In everything give thanks; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus." (1 Thess. 5:18)

October 9-12, I had the joy of co-leading the last of nine Pathways workshops for the Mundio Extendido denomination in Guatemala with the Pathways Latin America Director, Mike Gunderson. We listened to 21 messages in three days, critiquing and encouraging each one. The group has been mostly pastors and a couple teachers in the churches. This group has taken the training back to their respective districts and taught it to others. Several times Mike said he was very happy with what he was seeing as they gave their sermons. He said that, with possible the exception of a seminary trained group, this was the best ninth workshop group he has seen.

The denomination president, Atilano, said the training is changing the denomination. They were so excited for their graduation ceremony and diplomas. It was quite a ceremony with flags, national anthem, marching in and out, songs, a charge, prayers and a tamale reception.

It was such a delight to watch these brothers and sister open and teach God's Word with accuracy and clarity. I found myself over and over thanking the Lord that He allowed me to be part of such a significant thing in His kingdom. 
### **Young Moms Meeting Together**
