- 1. Have you ever considered being a missionary? Have you ever thought of yourself as a missionary now?
- 2. In Matthew 10:1-15 Jesus sent out the 12 disciples. What did He want them to concern, and not concern, themselves with?
- 3. From Matthew 10:16-23 what were some of the hardships Jesus told His disciples they could expect? How did He tell them to prepare themselves for this?
- 4. Jesus describes what to expect for those who will go on mission for Him in the future in Matthew 10:24-42.

What does He tell them they can expect in verses 24-27? Does He give any encouragement for this?

What reasons does He give for not giving in to fear in verses 26-31? Does He give any comfort?

What priorities does Jesus lay out for His followers in verses 32-39?

Jesus tells His disciples there will be a reward in verses 40-42. What is the reward and is this encouraging to you? Explain.

5. Personal application: Are you on mission with Jesus? What does it look like for you? Is anything holding you back? Would you like help with this?
