The Fullness of Time

I often think about the verse with the phrase, "the fullness of time," during the Christmas season. For most of us "fullness of time" is probably more like a commentary on our calendar

and daily pace, than understanding the meaning in the verse! Here's the verse and the following verse, "But when the fullness of the time came, God sent forth His Son, born of a woman, born under the Law, ⁵ so that He might redeem those who were under the Law, that we might receive the adoption as sons." (*Galatians 4:4-5*). "The fullness of time" means that Jesus was sent into the world at just the right time in human history. "Fullness" has the connotation of completion. If we look at what happened concerning the spread of the gospel after Jesus' resurrection, we would see how things like language and transportation, and the political, cultural, and religious climate, were "complete" like never before in the world.

Perhaps most important is how Judaism and the practice of the Law had developed. Enough time had passed for it to be evident that no one could achieve the righteousness of God by law-keeping, and that sin could not be mastered. Sin was even permeating the spiritual leadership, those entrusted with the teaching and application of God's Word. What a mess. Where would the world be now if God hadn't intervened when He did?

Thankfully God did intervene. The "fullness of time" had come. "For there is one God, *and* one mediator also between God and men, *the* man Christ Jesus, ⁶ who gave Himself as a ransom for all, the testimony *given* at the proper time." (*1 Timothy 2:5-6*). Jesus arrived, "and saying, 'The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand; repent and believe in the gospel." (*Mark 1:15*).

As we join in celebrating the coming of Christ this Christmas season, let's remember with gratitude that we live in a glorious time. Christ Jesus has come as our ransom; He has finished our redemption on the cross. We have a record of it. We have been invited to "receive the adoption" and enter the kingdom of the King of Kings and Lord of Lords!

Let's also remember that there will be a "fullness of time" for His return. Speaking of His return the apostle Paul wrote, "which He will bring about at the proper time—He who is the blessed and only Sovereign, the King of kings and Lord of lords," (*1 Timothy 6:15*).

Let's also remember that Christmas may be "the fullness of time" in the lives of people we know. They could be ready to hear the life-giving good news of Jesus Christ. Christmas might present the opportunity for that conversation. Perhaps we should live each day like we are in "the fullness of time!"


Greeting Ministry


A BIG thank you to all who volunteered talent, time, cupcakes, and bingo prizes for

<u>**Prayer Ministry:**</u> Do you pray for our missionaries? They have many needs and responsibilities. They have many of the same needs we do and also many different ones.

It's not easy to live in another country. The culture is probably different than the one the missionary came from. The people they want to reach may speak a different language. The food may be very different. They are separated from their family and friends which can create loneliness. Missionaries are dependent on other people for their monthly support. Consider supporting a missionary financially.

Keep in contact with our missionaries by writing letters to them or calling them. Get to know them, the scope of their work, and their needs. This will help you to pray for them intelligently and regularly.

Recently my wife and I were privileged to have a missionary in our home for several days. He was also a former student of mine when I taught in a Christian school in Michigan. It was a privilege to get to know more about the scope of his ministry and his needs. Take time to pray and correspond with our missionaries. They need our prayers and encouragement.

I talked to my 92 year old aunt on the phone the other night. She prays for missionaries regularly. She also prays for family members daily. Pass a heritage of prayer on to your children. You will be blessed by this.

We just finished holding an Open House at 18 & 8th and many of you participated in greeting guests, hosting rooms, helping with set-up, painting, carpet cleaning, maintenance, and providing snacks for our guests. Thank you for your generosity of time and resources!

The Open House allowed Monroe residents & surrounding community friends who are planning future events to walk through and ask questions about the venue, and it also allowed others to sign up to help with Backpack Buddies and get information on meetings presently taking place there. For some of us at MBC it was the 1st or 2nd time in the building, and some of you noticed the remodeling that has already happened: new restrooms, updated entryway, much needed fresh paint throughout, wax on floors, and more.

Much more is yet to be done to make 18 & 8th a venue that causes our neighbors to consider our facility first when planning a family or business event, a community simulcast, or a simple meeting. We are asking you to consider coming alongside the 18 & 8th planning team with your year-end donations. The Deacons have approved 18 & 8th as a special end of the year giving project this year.

Would you consider giving towards a new Prep Room at 18 & 8th at year's end? The Prep Room is an area where groups can disperse snacks, coffee, and drinks while holding an event such as a game night or movie event. The plan for the Prep Room will be a simple upper level room between the conference room and entryway. To update this space we will need a couple of serving counters & cupboards, two serving windows, a refrigerator, a grinder, and a large coffee maker installed in order to make this a welcoming area for the community to enjoy. There are further plans to update several of the rooms, besides the Prep Room. Contact Pastor Dan or I for details.

Some of you may have the gift of time and a willingness to help in any number of ways. In the near future we will be looking for friendly volunteers who enjoy hosting events, serving as security for evening events, or answering questions for our new friends. We hope that some of our Life Groups will consider serving together and creating events such as a community game night, or something to invite members of the community to. Let us know if that is something you are interested in doing as an act of ministry. As the new venue is recognized in the community and requests for use increase, we will have growing opportunities for many to serve and engage our neighbors at 18 & 8th.

We are excited about the possibilities that this venue will provide our community. We are just as excited about how God might lead our Church Family. Will you dream with us? Will you be praying for God's leading? Will you volunteer in 2020? Let's move ahead together as the Lord leads.
