More Blessed

It's not about you. Or, me. I think we can all agree to that, at least in theory. But in practice? This will be the new theme for the beginning of the new year. We live in a self-centered culture which promotes a lifestyle that does not reflect the Christian faith. It's important for us to see this, for it is very easy to

simply become part of the culture. This is an area of life in which we should be counter-culture, it should be obvious to those around us, and lived in an attractive way.

James warned about selfish ambition, "But if you have bitter jealousy and selfish ambition in your heart, do not be arrogant and so lie against the truth. ¹⁵ This wisdom is not that which comes down from above, but is earthly, natural, demonic. ¹⁶ For where jealousy and selfish ambition exist, there is disorder and every evil thing." (*James 3:14-16*). Paul urged unselfishness, "Do nothing from selfishness or empty conceit, but with humility of mind regard one another as more important than yourselves; ⁴ do not *merely* look out for your own personal interests, but also for the interests of others." (*Philippians 2:3-4*).

Here's some areas in which it might be good to ask ourselves if we need a reminder, "It's not about you."

- 1. Bible reading and prayer in devotions. Whether it's personal or family devotions, if we approach this time with an, "I need to get something out of it," attitude, where do you think we'll end up? What if our attitude was, "I need to give God my undivided attention, and it doesn't matter whether I get moved by a good feeling or not."?
- 2. Sunday morning worship service. Some of us, who are hurting, overwhelmed, or feeling beat up, need to just come and drink in from God. I've been there. Others of us may not even realize that we come primarily for what we can get out of it for ourselves. If that's how we come, week after week, we will likely be unhappy with the music, the volume, the lights, the sermon, the people, the temperature, or something else. Shouldn't we come thinking, "God, I come to give thanks and worship to You, to allow You to correct or direct my life in whatever way You choose, and to build up others in their faith."?
- 3. Life Group. It's natural to expect to get something out of going to Life Group. What if every person came to bless others? What would your experience be if you chose to be a blessing by praying for each group member, by calling to check up, sharing from your bounty, giving a helping hand, being prepared to share at the weekly meeting, and giving encouragement while there?
- 4. Ministries. Our brothers and sisters in Christ work hard to provide classes, training, fellowship, and outreach events. It isn't that we need to attend every event that is offered. However, if what we did choose to go to, and our mindset were, "How can I build up and encourage those who are here?", what effect might it have on the impact of our ministries?
- 5. Christian service. Every week I hear it, "I'm soooo busy." I'm busy too, too busy. I just try not to say it because it's my fault. If I don't have time to show the love of Christ to a needy hurting church member or outsider, I have to ask myself who I'm serving, who I'm pleasing, and who I'm exalting.

Imagine with me what our church would be like if the words of John the Baptist, "He must increase, but I must decrease." (John 3:30) dominated our church culture? Don't you think people would feel compelled to return? And then to get involved? I'm all for fun and enjoyment of life. I believe God is pleased to see His people joyful. However, when looking out for our fun takes the place of His will in our lives, it should probably be called idolatry. To the Elders at Ephesus Paul wrote, "In everything I showed you that by working hard in this manner you must help the weak and remember the words of the Lord Jesus, that He Himself said, 'It is more blessed to give than to receive." (Acts 20:35). I have to ask myself if I'm experiencing this blessing? How about you?

STEP* INTO THE NEW YEAR Make this craft to


remember God's many blessings.

What you need:

- Small stones
- Permanent markers
- Foil pan and cooking spray
- Drop cloth
- Gloves
- Quick-set concrete (and adult help)
- Bucket and paint stirrer

What you do:

- 1. After reflecting on the past year, use markers to decorate stones with memorable words, dates and drawings.
- 2. Spray pan with cooking spray. Set pan outside on a drop cloth.
- 3. Wearing gloves, mix concrete in a bucket, according to instructions.
- 4. Pour concrete into pan. Smooth top with paint stirrer.
- 5. Press in stones, handprints and other decorations.
- 6. Let dry completely. Remove from pan.
- 7. Place the stepping-stone outside as a reminder of God's continued goodness.
