Three Marks of a Disciple

I. Three Disciples Saw (1-13)

A disciple must learn to listen to Jesus.

II. Nine Disciples Taught (14-23)

A disciple needs to learn to <u>believe</u> in God.

III. The Priority in Power (24-27)

A disciple should learn when to *yield* their *rights*.

The Lord will help me learn to <u>listen</u>, <u>believe</u>, and <u>yield</u> to Him, so that I might more fully live *on mission* with Him!

What are the 1-2 biggest risks you've taken that required you to trust God to do something?

4. Read Matthew 17:24-27. What point is Jesus is making in verses 25-26?

What principle is Jesus demonstrating in verse 27, by saying He didn't want to offend?

5. List 4-5 things Christians are free to do, things which in the end, undermine their testimony and/or ministry.

Do you need to work on one of these? What can you do?

6. What is the main application of this study, and/or the sermon and its passages, for you?
