You've Got Purpose. Do You Have Direction?



Someone once said, "If you aim at nothing, you'll hit it every time." Well, that's a cute saying, but sadly it can become a true commentary of our lives. While we ought to be on guard against selfish ambition (James 3:14-16), we also ought to be on guard against idleness with our faith (2 Thess. 3:11; 1 Tim 5:13). I suspect some in the church aren't sure what

they should do to be a good follower of Jesus. The elders have outlined some tangible goals to help us focus our lives, and give direction to our attempts to help others follow Christ. Below I will describe the first level.

The *objective of the first level (of four) is to get established in the foundational disciplines of the Christian life. The target is the heart.* This is where we choose which direction we will go. In reading through the Gospel of Mark I noticed how Jesus scolded His disciples, and condemned the religious leaders, for their hardness of heart (Mark 3:5; 6:52; 7:6; 10:5; 16:14). He identified the heart as the source of our sin (Mark 7:15, 21). What Jesus identified as the most important commandment also pointed to our hearts, "AND YOU SHALL LOVE THE LORD YOUR GOD WITH ALL YOUR HEART, AND WITH ALL YOUR SOUL, AND WITH ALL YOUR MIND, AND WITH ALL YOUR STRENGTH.' (*Mark 12:30, NASB*). Hence, we want to learn to pay attention to our hearts in relation to the Lord. We are exhorted, "Watch over your heart with all diligence, For from it *flow* the springs of life. (*Proverbs 4:23*)

The <u>first goal</u> is to establish the habits of *a growing relationship with Christ*, which are sometimes called the disciplines. Paul practiced the disciplines himself. "Therefore I run in such a way, as not without aim; I box in such a way, as not beating the air; ²⁷ but I discipline my body and make it my slave, so that, after I have preached to others, I myself will not be disqualified." (*1 Corinthians 9:26-27*). Paul urged Timothy to do the same, "On the other hand, discipline yourself for the purpose of godliness; ⁸ for bodily discipline is only of little profit, but godliness is profitable for all things, since it holds promise for the present life and *also* for the *life* to come." (*1 Timothy 4:7b-8*). Paul also commended the Colossians, "For even though I am absent in body, nevertheless I am with you in spirit, rejoicing to see your good discipline and the stability of your faith in Christ." (*Colossians 2:5*). Establishing this in the home with children is a primary responsibility of parents (Eph. 6:4). The first two foundational disciplines are daily intake of God's Word and prayer, in what is called devotions, or quiet time. If this isn't part of your daily routine, I urge you to start today!

The <u>second goal</u> is to establish *a growing relationship with Christ's church*. There are many New Testament references to the believer's commitment to fellow believers in the body of Christ. For example, "Be devoted to one another in brotherly love; give preference to one another in honor; ¹¹ not lagging behind in diligence, fervent in spirit, serving the Lord; ¹² rejoicing in hope, persevering in tribulation, devoted to prayer, ¹³ contributing to the needs of the saints, practicing hospitality. (Romans 12:10-13). Also often cited is, "and let us consider how to stimulate one another to love and good deeds, ²⁵ not forsaking our own assembling together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging *one another;* and all the more as you see the day drawing near." (Hebrews 10: 24-25). Regular church attendance, joining a Life Group, and church membership, are three key ways to demonstrate a commitment to grow in Christ's body. Have you made these commitments?

The <u>third goal</u> in the first level is *a growing relationship with Christ's mission*. Jesus made the mission of the church clear, make disciples (Matthew 28:18-20). We see the importance of being involved in Christ's mission of disciple-making within the church, and in the world outside the church. The Lord has given every believer at least one spiritual gift (Rom. 12:6-8; 1 Cor. 12:7-11; 1 Pet. 4:10-11) to be used in His church. We want to help everyone discern their gifting, and find a meaningful place of service in a ministry at MBC. Our participation in Christ's mission outside the church will be through involvement as a witness and a testimony for Christ. We want to help everyone to grow in these experiences. Our primary ways of helping you are through *Next Steps, Pipeline*, and *Life Groups*.

There you have it, some simple direction on what to get established in your own life, and how to help others. Make these a priority, and you're aiming at the bullseye of what the Lord desires for your life.

We all grew up with families and experiences that helped us develop our sense of identities, and set "rules" to life which carried with us throughout adulthood. Somewhat like a picture window, these experiences framed us to have unique perspectives of what the world was about, how families function, and what to value in our lives. While growing up with these unique windows of perspective, we only knew what we were taught and automatically assumed it was right. Messages and belief systems began to be imprinted upon us that taught us about ourselves, what to expect from people, how to live our lives, what roles to play, and how to care about the people around us. We also developed our concept of God or our lack of belief in Him. As we approached adulthood, our lives played out on the basis of those acquired beliefs. The Christian Codependence Recovery Workbook: From Surviving to Significance by Stephanie Tucker is designed to help you find who God created you to be. Codependence isn't a label, but a mindset that can be overcome. There is healing in Jesus' name.

What is Codependency? To the codependent, control, or the lack of it, is central to every aspect of life. Codependency can be defined as an addiction to people, behaviors, or things. It is the fallacy of trying to control inner feelings by controlling people, things, and events on the outside.
