Are You Ready?

I. Ready in the Moment (1-13)

Be ready for Christ's return *every day*!

II. Ready in Mission (14-30)

Faithful use of <u>material possessions</u> for Christ reveals <u>real</u> and ready believers.

III. Ready in Ministry (31-46)

<u>Ministry</u> to the <u>needs</u> of the Lord's <u>suffering</u> people will reveal <u>real</u> and ready believers.

My <u>walk</u> with <u>Christ</u> will make me ready to meet Christ on that day!

- 1. What are some of the unbiblical ideas about heaven and hell that you've heard? How did you respond?
- 2. Read Matthew 25:1-13. What's the main idea of the parable?

What do the door (v. 10) and the groom's answer (v. 12) represent?

What do the actions and outcomes of the virgins represent?

What does it mean for you to be "alert" and "prudent" today? Are you?

3. Read the parable of the talents in Matthew 25:14-28. Think about the master's response to the first two slaves. Does the prospect of hearing those words motivate you? In what way?

Describe what, "Well done, good and faithful," looks like for your life.

- 4. What is the "more" and the "abundance" of verse 29? Do you desire it? Why or why not?
- 5. Read Matthew 25:31-46. Jesus is speaking about a coming judgment day. What are the two destinies? What will reveal the destiny of people?

How can you express your faith in one of these ways? (Verses 35-36)

6. Look back over Matthew 25 and think about how your life reflects belief in Christ Jesus, heaven, and hell. Is there one thing you would like to change in your life to better reflect your beliefs?
