Sincere gratitude is what we're feeling right now as we give thanks to God for providing us with housing when we return to the United States in May. We have been offered a place to live in northern Illinois for several weeks, and then we'll be transitioning

to Chattanooga, Tennessee in mid-June where we have been offered housing through First Baptist Church of Hixson. The house has ample space for Chloe and Sarah, and is just 15 minutes from where Chloe's soon-to-be in-laws live in Red Bank. We'll be living there until after Chloe and Connor's wedding on September 14, at which time we'll take Sarah to Seattle for college. We couldn't be more grateful! It's an exciting time! Chloe is preparing to graduate from Taylor University on May 23rd, and Sarah is finishing her 2nd quarter at Seattle Pacific University. 2020 continues to be a year of transition for us, and we are looking forward to slowing down a bit this summer to rest, pray, and also help Chloe and Connor with their wedding plans.

Of course, we'll miss the home in which we've been living for the past six years, but our landlords have asked us to move out so that they can paint and renovate, then put the house on the market. They assured us that if the house hasn't sold when we return, we are welcome to move back in. We will miss this place we've called home. We cherished our time here as a family, remembering God's goodness to us in this home, but then also looking ahead to the next season God has for us.

Brian has one of the best seats in the house streaming video for ICSB's annual basketball tournament. More than 1000 viewers watched the 22 games that were streamed over the course of three days in mid-February. This is a significant outreach at our school and we were blessed to host teams from Russia, Ukraine, Romania, and Czechia.

We've been having fun with an English drama club that has been meeting since September. One of our close friends returned to the US in February after more than six years on the field, so that left us with an opening in our teaching team. We have about 10 boys who regularly show up and I thought it would be GREAT if Brian would step in to work with the students, especially the boys. They need good role models in their lives, and Brian is quite the actor! Our production is *Tom Sawyer* which has also been culturally interesting for our Hungarian students. They're learning a bunch of Southern slang that is completely, grammatically incorrect - LOL - but so much fun!!

Together with nine other women at Riverside Church Budapest, I am facilitating a discussion of the book "Emotionally Healthy Spirituality" by Peter Scazzero. One of the rich challenges is diving in to a book with women from Hungary, Ghana, Kenya, Bulgaria, and the United States. We all come from so many different backgrounds and contexts! It's truly a blessing to watch how God is working in each of our lives.

You are a significant part of the work in Europe and we don't take that for granted. Thanks for your friendship, prayers, and the discipline you model when you faithfully give to the Lord's work through us in Europe and Hungary.
