I. The Gentiles (27-38)

II. The Jews (39-44)

III. The Death (45-53)

Jesus subjected Himself to death on the cross as a divine act.

IV. The Responses (54-66)

There were different responses to the death of Jesus.

1. Can you think of an example of a significant sacrifice someone made for you? What effect did it have on you?

2. Read Matthew 27:27-38. What words are used to describe how Jesus was treated? What words would you use to describe His treatment?

Why do you think Jesus subjected Himself to death like this? Why is all this detail recorded?

3. Read Matthew 27:39-44. What words would you use to describe the way Jesus was treated in this section?

Why would this treatment of Jesus have been recorded for us?

Reflect on the way Jesus was treated in the passages above. What application can you make to your life?

4. Read Matthew 27:45-53. Why is verse 46 important to read?

Why is verse 50 important to know?

How do verse 45, and verses 51-53 add meaning to the death of Jesus?

5. What words would you use to describe the different responses to the death of Jesus in Matthew 27:54-66?

What word or words would you use to describe your response to the death of Jesus? Would you like to change anything about your response? Explain.
