God's People in the Pandemic

I'm sure that you, like me, were disappointed to hear that our "Safer at Home" order was extended another month. As we move through this new experience, two things have become very apparent: man doesn't know for sure what to do, and man doesn't know what the future will look like. Many are upset about this. But that's not really a new revelation for us, and we know God knows not only what to do, but also the future! Jesus told us long ago not to worry about tomorrow, for our Father knows what we need and He cares for us. (Matthew 6:25-34). As His children we are to seek first His kingdom and His righteousness (Matthew 6:33). This should set us apart from the rest of the population that does not know Him.

The frustration and/or fear of many is turning to protest rallies, conspiracy theories are flying, and opinions (not necessarily factual) are spreading like wildfire. Some are boldly defying the social distancing orders we've been given by our governing authorities. What should our response be? I suggest we be concerned for three things: the safety of others, our testimony to outsiders, and our freedom (religious freedom in particular) should concern us. The challenge is to not neglect one of these concerns in the interest of another. While social media, like Facebook, have great potential for spreading the good news of Jesus, they also easily become the means of tarnishing the good news of Jesus, especially when those who bear His name don't represent Him well.

I once heard a wise older pastor say, "Politics divide, the gospel unites." It seems that almost everything today ends up a political issue. There is little accountability for truthfulness, and disagreement quickly becomes demonization. Beware of getting caught up in it, for it will greatly hinder your disciple-making opportunities. Ephesians 4:29 says, "Let no unwholesome word proceed from your mouth, but only such a word as is good for edification according to the need of the moment, so that it will give grace to those who hear." 1 Peter 3:15 reminds us that our defense should be said "with gentleness and reverence," reflecting the hope that is in us. Our hope (confident expectation) is in Christ, it is the new and eternal life He has given us. Our hope is not that a temporary issue is resolved according to our liking!

Here are what I think are critical things for us to remember as we go through this: our citizenship is in heaven, Christ is our Lord, making disciples is His order, and loving God and others are our priorities.

The apostle Paul said this, "For our citizenship is in heaven, from which also we eagerly wait for a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ" (*Philippians 3:20, NASB*). We need to be careful that we don't lose sight of our first citizenship and what we really want. The fear or fighting that have become common, reflect overvaluing the passing present world. Jesus is our Lord; He is the One we listen to and follow. What does God tell us in terms of obeying the law? "Remind them to be subject to rulers, to authorities, to be obedient, to be ready for every good deed, 2 to malign no one, to be peaceable, gentle, showing every consideration for all men." (*Titus 3:1-2*, see also Romans 13:1-2 and 2 Peter 2:13-17). We have a wonderful right in our country to express our disagreement, but it should always be governed by the standard of truthfulness and respect that our Lord has given us.

Jesus gave us our orders, "Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ teaching them to observe all that I commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age." (*Matthew 28:19-20*). And what did Jesus tell us is most important? "AND YOU SHALL LOVE THE LORD YOUR GOD WITH ALL YOUR

HEART, AND WITH ALL YOUR SOUL, AND WITH ALL YOUR MIND, AND WITH ALL YOUR STRENGTH.' ³¹ "The second is this, 'YOU SHALL LOVE YOUR NEIGHBOR AS YOURSELF.' There is no other commandment greater than these." (*Mark 12:30-31*). Following the social distancing and other guidelines so that we don't spread a potentially deadly virus to others is the loving thing to do. The things we say, and how we say it, ought also to reflect loving others, even those we disagree with.

Since our citizenship is in heaven, Christ is our Lord, making disciples is His order, and loving God and others are our priorities – let's be messengers of hope!

Let's follow the apostle Paul's guidelines, "Let your speech always be with grace, as though seasoned with salt, so that you will know how you should respond to each person." (*Colossians 4:6*). Jesus said, "You are the salt of the earth; but if the salt has become tasteless, how can it be made salty again? It is no longer good for anything, except to be thrown out and trampled under foot by men." (*Matthew 5:13*). As salt we preserve what is good, promote cleansing and healing, and create thirst. He said, "Let your light shine before men in such a way that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father who is in heaven. (*Matthew 5:16*). It's our hour to shine, let's shine!



Due to the coronavirus quarantine, our OneMeal packing event scheduled for May 2nd has been cancelled. Whether it will be rescheduled later this year is currently unknown. The Guatemala Mission trip to construct a *Kids Around The World* playground is currently "on hold" to see what happens with the pandemic. The playground arrived in Guatemala, but whether our team will be able to travel there in July remains to be seen. Guatemala is currently under quarantine just as we are here in the U.S. and most of the mission trips scheduled with Oscar Chiquito for this summer have already been cancelled. The support that has been donated will be available either for this July or, if the trip is cancelled, for next year's trip. More details will come as things develop.

The worldwide pandemic is affecting our missionaries in many ways and creating increased need for most. Please get out your 2019-2020 World Missions booklet and start praying for these families and ministries. Most live far from their families and some live in areas with minimal health care available. Many have had their work altered. Nate and Shannon Ackerman and Art Sommerville were asked to return to the U.S. Most of our missionaries have email addresses listed in the booklet and would be blessed to know they are remembered by us in prayer. By communicating with them via email you can receive specific prayer requests and give them encouragement. As difficult as quarantine is for all of us, it also can open doors for the gospel to be heard by unbelievers everywhere. May we all be ready, as our missionaries are, to share the hope we have within us.
