1. Why might some people scoff at the idea of a resurrection?
2. Daniel is told (Daniel 12:1-4) that there will be a resurrection. What are the two destinies? What purpose would it serve to have him record this for future generations?
3. Read 2 Corinthians 5:1-5. The Holy Spirit is said to be a pledge for the believer. What would His work in the life of a believer serve as this pledge?
4. Read 2 Corinthians 5:6-8. Why would courage be mentioned twice?
Why did Paul see being "absent from the body" (dying) as good? (See also Philippians 1:21-23)
Do you have the same "welcoming death" attitude? Explain.
5. Read 1 Thessalonians 4:14-17. Where are believers who have died, and what will happen to them?
What does this say about the nature of the believer's existence, and their activity, for eternity?
6. From Revelation 20:11-15, what is the second death, who will experience it, and why? What response does this draw from you?
7. Read Revelation 21:1-3, 9-10. Where, and in what form, are the saints of all ages? What word would you use to describe their existence?
8. What application can you make to your study of these Scriptures?
