Pastor's Pen

Reentry

In last month's Pastor's Pen article, I stressed that we should be concerned about, "safety of others, our testimony to outsiders, and our freedom (religious freedom in particular)" as we face the Covid-19 pandemic. I issued a reminder that we've been commanded to be subject to rulers, (Titus 3; Romans 13 and 2 Peter 2), to love our neighbor (Mark 12:32), "let no unwholesome word proceed from your mouth" (Eph. 4:29), remember that our citizenship is in heaven (Philippians 3:20), and that disciplemaking is our priority (Matt. 28:19-20). I trust that you've all done well last month and that both your, and the church's, testimony has remained strong.

Hopefully we are on the backside of the Covid-19 surge and it will not return later this year to any significant degree. Thankfully it did not hit our area nearly as hard as feared. However, there is another dark danger lurking in the shadows. It hasn't hit us as hard as it might have either, but we aren't on the backside of this one yet. We might compare it to a space capsule's reentry to the earth's atmosphere and the danger it faces of burning up. I'll call ours the church's reentry into church meetings. The danger of burning up is through divisiveness. Just like our space engineers need to make sure a space capsule has a sufficient shield and proper orientation as it enters earth's atmosphere, we need to be properly "shielded" and "oriented" as we reenter church life. This will be a challenge for the congregation, but one that I feel we will succeed in and grow through.

As we enter into church services and meetings once again, people will come with differing opinions about the level of risk and how our governing officials, and church leaders, have handled it. Our "survival shield" will be the steps we take to protect ourselves. There are a variety of different dangers perceived in our congregation. Some of us are, or have people in our families, that are physically vulnerable to sickness. Some of us are struggling emotionally from isolation, or with fear of contracting Covid-19. Some are fearful of financial loss. Some feel our leaders overstepped, others feel they haven't done enough. These are just a few of the differing thoughts and feelings in our congregation. For some the need to be in church and with one another is very significant. For others the need to hold off for a while is significant. For others there is a desire to come, but discomfort with getting too close to people. We each need to do what helps us feel safe, AND, respect what others feel they need. These are not doctrinal differences, but do reflect spiritual maturity.

Let's make sure we don't pull our justification for meeting out of Hebrews 10 and ignore what is immediately there as well. I'll underline it, "and let us <u>consider how to stimulate one another to love and good deeds</u>, ²⁵ not forsaking our own assembling together, as is the habit of some, <u>but encouraging one another</u>; and all the more as you see the day drawing near. (Hebrews 10:24-25).

I think we should consider an emphasis on unity and our mission our proper orientation. Jesus stressed unity. In His prayer the last evening before His arrest He said, "I do not ask on behalf of these alone, but for those also who believe in Me through their word; ²¹ that they may all be one; even as You, Father, *are* in Me and I in You, that they also may be in Us, so that the world may believe that You sent Me. ²² The glory which You have given Me I have given to them, that they may be one, just as We are one; ²³ I in them and You in Me, that they may be perfected in unity, so that the world may know that You sent Me, and loved them, even as You have loved Me." (*John 17:20-23*). His prayer was that the kind of unity that exists in the godhead, a unity of purpose, and mission, and steeped in love, would exist among His followers. The words of Jesus, "that the world may know" emphasize how powerful a statement the unity of a diverse group of people can make to the watching world

Strongly held different opinions quickly become divisive when people forcefully express and/or defend them, or take offense at them. James warns his readers, "Do not speak against one another, brethren. He who speaks against a brother or judges his brother, speaks against the law and judges the law; but if you judge the law, you are not a doer of the law but a judge *of it.* ¹² There is *only* one Lawgiver and Judge, the One who is able to save and to destroy; but who are you who judge your neighbor? (*James 4:11-12, NASB*). Paul also warns his readers not to judge or "regard your brother with contempt" (Romans 14:4, 10).

The only way any group of diverse people with differing opinions can be united is by elevating the priority of its purpose, its mission, and love for one another, above personal preferences and opinions. Our purpose is to glorify God, our mission is disciplemaking, and God made it clear that love for one another is to be our priority. As we begin to come together this needs to be our "orientation."

Different people will be "reentering" corporate church life at different times over the next several weeks. As we respect each other's different opinions and responses to Covid-19, look for ways to demonstrate love for one another, and strive to build unity, we will grow as a congregation. Let's not forget that we have an adversary and this may be a small challenge compared to what lies ahead. Don't burn now!

Don't' wait! For most of you, your child protection certifications are expiring in the next two months. Monroe Bible Church requires annual certification training for everyone who works with youth in any capacity, with background checks done every four years on adults. Now is the time to contact the office (office@monroebiblechurch.org) church with the email address you would like to use in order to complete your annual training. you've contacted the office you will receive an email from Mobilize My Ministry requesting information, then another email with a link to complete your training online. The training consists of a video followed by a quiz, and takes about 45 minutes to complete. The office is notified once you've successfully completed your training.

Unleavened Bread Recipe:

2 cups flour

1/4 cup brown sugar

3/4 cup (12 Tablespoons) melted unsalted butter

1/4 cup water

2 Tablespoons honey

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Mix all ingredients in a bowl. Knead on a floured pastry cloth and roll out 1/2 inch thick. Transfer to a greased cookie sheet. Bake 17 minutes. Cool. Cut into desired size pieces.
