Babies and Big People

I. Maturing (1-4)

<u>Christian</u> <u>conduct</u> reveals spiritual maturity.

II. Serving (5-9)

Spiritual maturing is the result of <u>God's work</u>.

III. Testing (10-15)

A *spiritually maturing* ministry will build on Christ as the foundation.

IV. Admonishing (16-23)

God has given us everything to mature us in Christ.

- 5. What are the warnings given to worldly wisdom in 1 Corinthians 3:16-20?
- 6. What does Paul mean by "all things belong to you" in verses 21-23?
 What are the 2-3 hardest things that "belong to you" in life right now?
 How can they be good for you?
- 7. Think about your spiritual growth, struggle with the flesh, temptation of human wisdom, and the Spirit's ministry in your life. What is the Spirit telling you that you need to do?
