## Infection! Help!

## I. The Conduct (1-2)

The church should <u>mourn</u> and <u>address</u>, not <u>accommodate</u> flagrant sin in its midst.

## II. The Concerns (3-8)

The church needs to address the sin out of concern for the *person*, the *congregation*, and the *worship gathering*.

## III. The Clarification (9-13)

The action prescribed for the church is <u>non-association</u> and applies to the so-called <u>Christian</u> in the church.

4. Read 1 Corinthians 5:6-8. Paul warns the church of what danger for not addressing the sinner?

How might unaddressed flagrant sin affect worship in a church?

What effect might unaddressed sin have on your own life?

5. Read 1 Corinthians 5:9-13. What action is being prescribed for the church to take and who is it to be applied to?

What are some examples of how a church might fail to properly apply the principles put forth in this chapter?

- 6. How could you apply Christ to addressing a sin problem in your church?
- 7. Make a personal application from this chapter.
