## Are Marriage & Remarriage Okay?

I. Complexities in Marriage (25-35)

It will be easier to be <u>devoted</u> to the <u>Lord</u> if you remain in your <u>marital status</u>.

II. Concessions to Marriage (36-40)

It is <u>better</u> to remain single if <u>acceptable</u>, but if not, marry <u>another believer</u>.

- 1. Do you think marriage is more difficult today than in the past? Explain.

What are some of your more challenging circumstances?

3. In verses 29-31 Paul gives instructions to live "as though" in several areas. What does this mean and why does he urge this?

Do you think this applies to the Corinthians and their circumstances, or to our time as well? Explain.

If you knew you had only 2 years left to live, what would you do differently?

4. Paul points out that the married person will (rightly) be concerned with how to please their spouse in verses 32-35. What does he say should be most important for all Christians? How would you describe it?

What challenges you to living like this? What helps most?

- 5. In verses 36-40 what does Paul think is better than marriage or remarriage? What needs to be considered?
- 6. What is your personal application to the teaching in this passage?
