## I. Message to the Corinthians

Heads of women should be <u>covered</u> and heads of men <u>uncovered</u> in worship services.

## II. Reasons

- 1. <u>Headship</u> (v. 3, 10)
- 2. <u>Culture</u> (v. 2, 4-6, 13-16)
- 3. <u>Creation Order</u> (v. 7-9, 11-12)
- 4. *Angels* (v. 10)

## III. Message to Us

Maintain the <u>distinctions</u> between the <u>sexes</u> and the roles of <u>authority</u> in your worship services.

<u>Application Questions</u> - These questions are provided for your further study and application of the subject of today's message. - 1. Have you seen a woman or women wearing a head covering in a church? What was your reaction?
- 2. Read 1 Corinthians 11:2-3. What do you think the metaphor "head" means? How does a person put the meaning of it into practice?
- 3. From verses 4-6, what does it mean to "disgrace" (or dishonor) one's head? Why is the opposite action a disgrace for men and women?

What are some of the ways a person might disgrace him or herself in the church today?

- 4. Read 1 Corinthians 11:7-9. How would you explain a woman as "the glory of man" to an unbelieving woman outside the church today?
- 5. What does "because of the angels" mean in verse 10? What effect should knowing this have on you in a worship service?
- 6. What purpose does the term "independent" in verses 11-12 serve in the message of this passage?
- 7. Finally, Paul appeals to 3 more reasons for the head covering in verses 13-16. What are they?
- 8. Do you think this passage teaches that women should wear a head covering today? Why or why not?
- 9. What is the practical application of this passage for you?
