A King is Coming

I. The Proclamation of Jesus (Matt. 16:27; 24:30; 25:31-32; 26:64)

Jesus unequivocally said that He would come in glory, and from His throne judge the world.

II. The Preaching of Peter (Acts 1:11; 2:29-36)

Peter boldly declared that Jesus is the Lord, seated at God's right hand, and that His enemies will be defeated.

III. The Prophecy of John (Rev 1:5- 7; 11:15; 22:7, 12-13, 20)

It was revealed to the apostle John that Jesus will return to reign over all the earth.

How does knowing this affect how I live today?

Application Questions - *These questions are provided for your further study and application of the subject of today's message. Thoughtfully writing out answers to these questions will help drive home the point. They are designed to be discussed in your home, with other believers, and in a Life Group, for even more benefit.*

1. Do you tend to "leave Jesus in the manger" after Christmas day and move on to other things? Do you have a tradition that helps you remember to connect His first and second comings?

2. What does Jesus tell people in each of the following verses that He will do? Matthew 16:27; 24:30; 25:31-32; 26:64. What stands out to you in each verse?

What can, or do you do, that expresses your belief in this to be true?

3. Read the assurance the angel gives in Acts 1:11, then part of Peter's sermon in Acts 2:29-36. What does he tell the people about the past, present, and future of Jesus?

Do you have enemies for the Lord to defeat? (v. 35) Explain.

Explain, like you would to a new believer, what it means for Jesus to be your Lord. Give examples from your life.

4. The book of Revelation is a record of the revelation God gave John about things to come in the future. What is said about Jesus in Revelation 1:5-7; 11:15; 22:7, 12-13, 20?

What are some of the ways knowing this future affects how you live today?

5. What is one way that you would like to respond to what you've learned from these passages? It may be in your personal relationship with the Lord, something to encourage a fellow believer, or something you say, or do, for someone who has yet to believe. Ask those in your group or family to pray for God to help you do it.
