2. Matthew 28:19-20 records Jesus' words in what we call *The Great Commission*. What did Jesus say to do, and how? What did Jesus promise?

What are some of the different ways people can be involved in Disciple-making?

3. Read Mark 12:28-34. Verse 30 is called *The Great Commandment*. How does what happens next (v. 32-34) add understanding to verse 30?

What does loving God with all your being look like in your life?

What are some of the different ways people may love God? (i.e., express it)

4. What is the *New Commandment* that Jesus gives in John 13:34-35, and what purpose did He have for giving it?

Why does Jesus call it a "new" commandment? (See Lev. 19:18; Mk 12:31) When is keeping this commandment hardest for you? Why?

5. How does the gospel message help you keep what Jesus said in these passages a desire and not a burden?
